School Description

Emily Dickinson Elementary School is in Redmond, Washington. The first Emily Dickinson Elementary School was built in 1977 and currently houses the Dickinson Preschool. Our current elementary building was built in 1992. We have a total enrollment of 517 students, including preschool. As our students leave Dickinson Elementary, they attend Evergreen Middle School, and then Eastlake High School. In addition to Dickinson Elementary, our campus houses both Dickinson Preschool and Explorer Community School. Our main campus includes three Learning Center classrooms, one Safety Net classroom, a Resource classroom and an English Language Learners classroom. Additionally, many of our students are served through our Highly Capable pullout program.

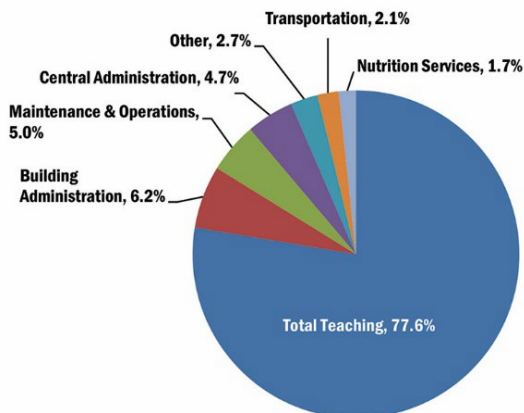
Our student population is rich with diversity and many of our students speak a variety of languages at home, including: 68% English, 7% Hindi, 7% Telugu, 5% Spanish, and 2% Tamil. Other languages spoken include Malayalam, Marathi, Arabic, Russian, Chinese, Hebrew and Kannada.

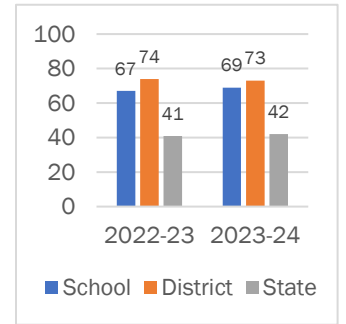

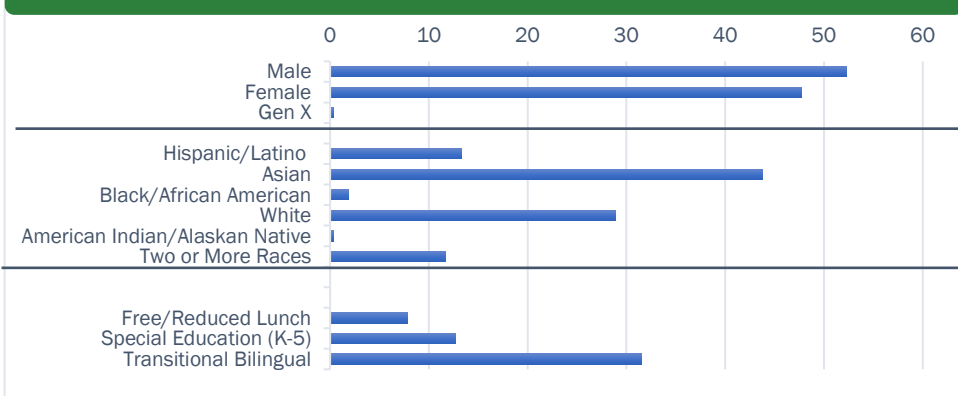
