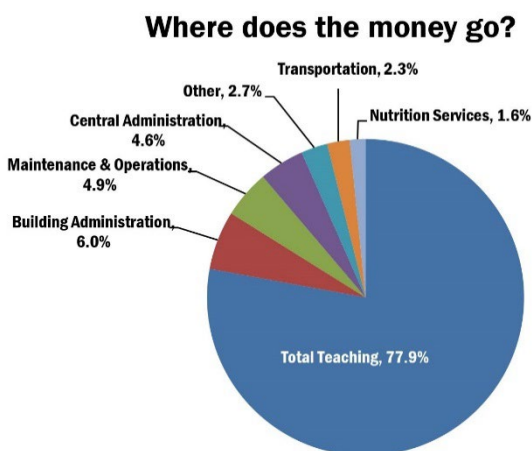
## School Description

Helen Keller Elementary School is a K-5 school located in Kirkland WA, nestled into a well-established neighborhood in the Juanita region. Students who attend Helen Keller move on to Kamiakin Middle School and graduate from Juanita High School. Our core values can be summarized with the acronym GRIP: Growth: developing intellectual abilities and social skills; Respect: treating others how you would like to be treated; Integrity: striving to make the right choices Perseverance: working hard and trying your best. We continue to see great strides toward progress and are confident that scores will increase as we continue working as a PLC and focus on the outcomes provided through the SBA interims, progress monitors, and end of year assessments.

Helen Keller has a wonderful staff who use research-based practices mixed with fresh ideas. All our educators work in collaborative teams, meeting weekly to develop common assessments, align curriculum, evaluate instructional strategies, and review and respond to student common assessment data.

## 2023-24 School Goals

The process used to determine annual school goals includes an in-depth building-wide analysis.

### English Language Arts/Literacy (Grades K-5):

80% of Keller students will make aggressive, typical, or modest growth as determined by their Winter and Spring growth goal data points in the FastBridge EarlyReading and aReading tests, increasing the number of students categorized as low risk.

### Mathematics (Grades K-5):

80% of Keller students will make aggressive, typical, or modest growth as determined by their Winter and Spring growth goal data points in the FastBridge EarlyMath and aMath tests, increasing the number of students categorized as low risk.

### Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (Grades K-5):

85% of students at Keller will have 1 office referral or less, as measured by office referral data.

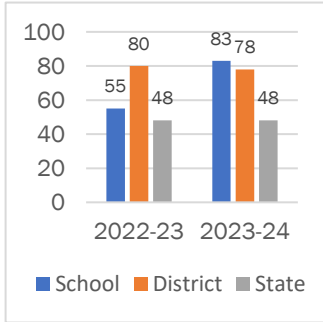
Subgroup goals:

- 100% of students at Keller with 5 or more office referrals will receive a research-based Tier 2 or Tier 3 intervention, with parent involvement.

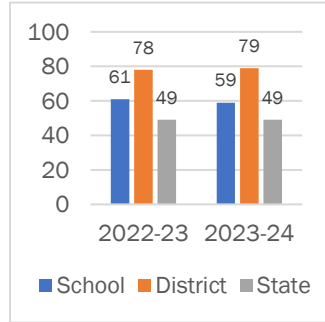

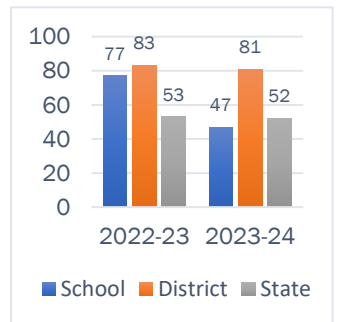
**3rd Grade English Language Arts**



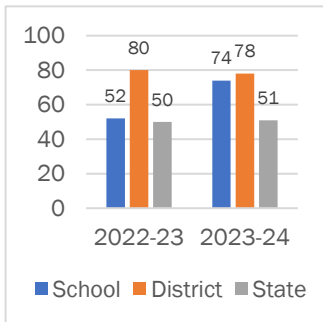
**4th Grade English Language Arts**



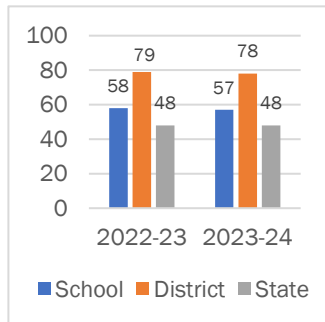
**5th Grade English Language Arts**



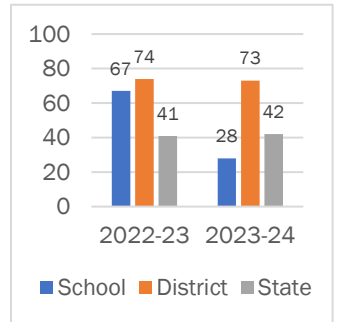
**3rd Grade Math**



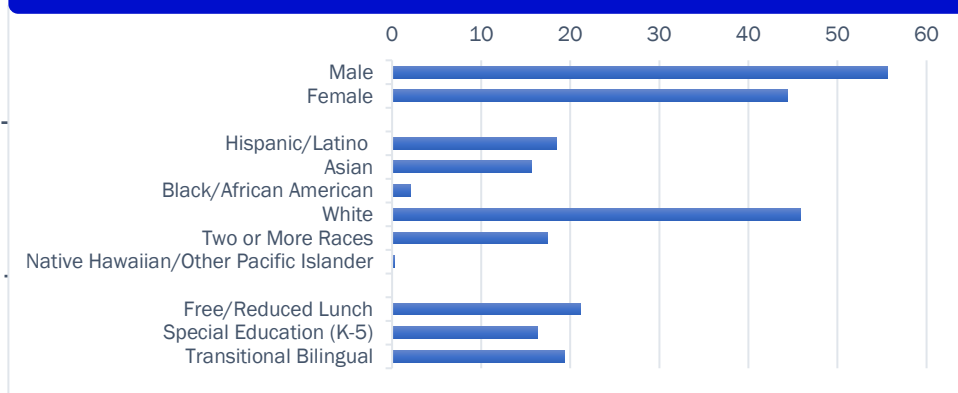
**4th Grade Math**
