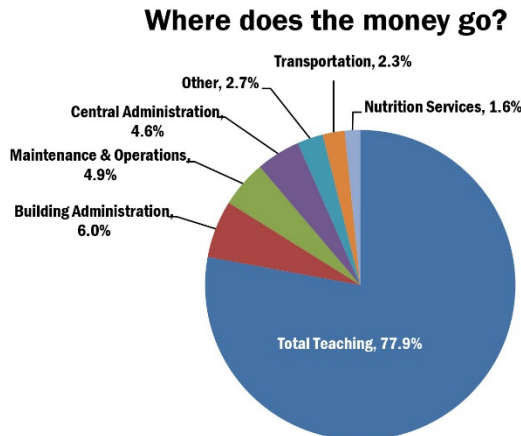
School Description

English Language Arts/Literacy (Grades K-5):

All students in Grade 5 will leave Sandburg Elementary for middle school reading at or above grade level. Students in grades K-4 will grow 1 year or more in reading levels from the fall to the spring.

90% or more of Kindergarten, 1st Grade and 2nd Grade students will demonstrate proficiency in the 'Phonemic Awareness' component as measured by earlyReading on the Screening-toIntervention (s2i) Report.

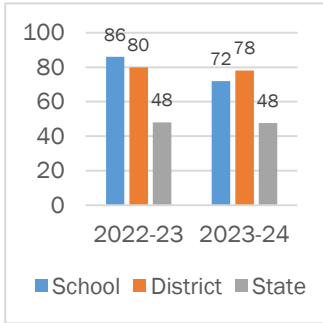
Behavior: Social Emotional Support and Social Emotional Instruction (Preschool-5):

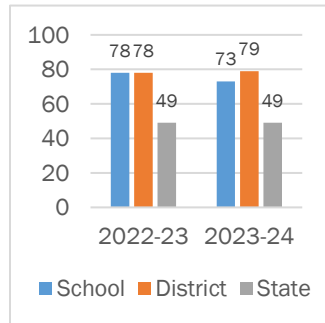

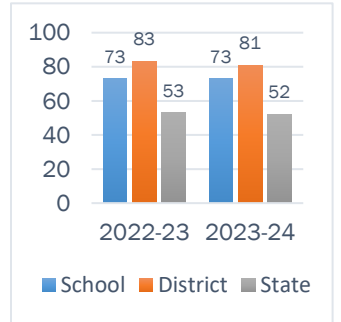
3rd Grade English Language Arts



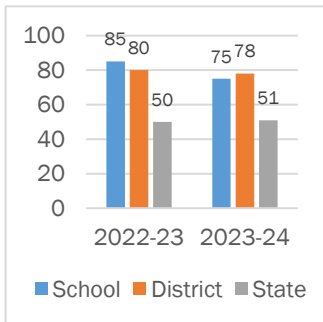
4th Grade English Language Arts



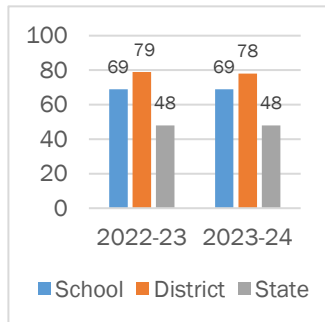
5th Grade English Language Arts



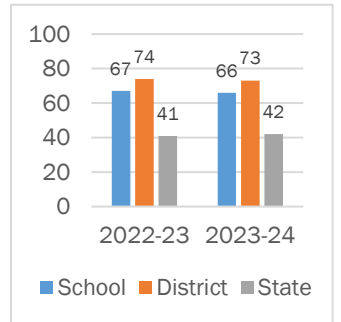
3rd Grade Math



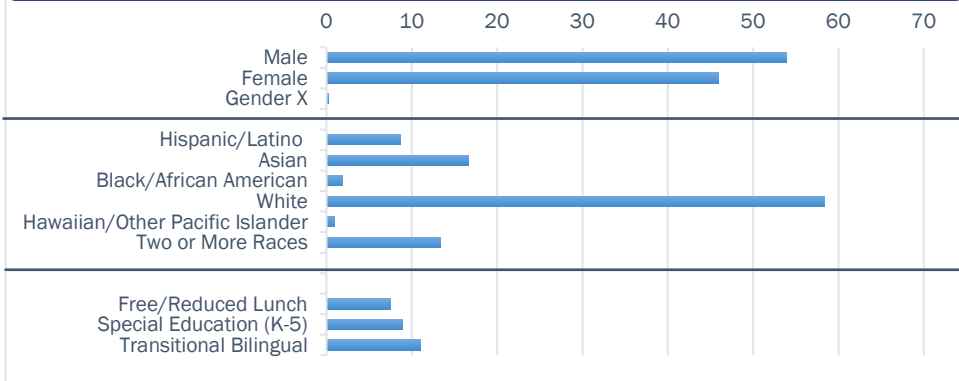
4th Grade Math
