## School Description


Redmond High School is located in a northeastern suburb of Seattle, Washington and is one of four comprehensive high schools in the Lake Washington School District, encompassing suburbs of Redmond, Kirkland, and Sammamish. One of the fastest growing areas in the state, Redmond is largely a middle to upper class community, formerly an agricultural and timber area, but now associated with rapidly expanding tech development.

Redmond High School is a four-year high school with an approximate total enrollment of 2,241 students. A class size limit of 32 exists for most class sections. Students have a number of courses from which to choose. Students can take advantage of Honors courses, Advanced Placement courses, UW in the high school (where students earn college credit while enrolled in classes they take at Redmond High School), full or part-time enrollment in Running Start (a dual enrollment program where college courses are taken at local community colleges), college in the high school, and WANIC classes (both in and outside of Lake Washington School District).
