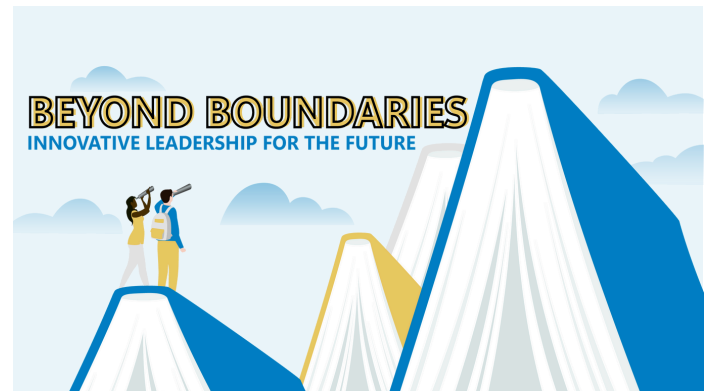
The four-day training not only explores what makes teams effective, but how to develop skills as facilitators and informed group members in informal and formal settings, in small and large groups. It takes participants beyond the idea of professional learning communities to the actual implementation, describing specific ways to weave the collaborative fabric of a faculty, develop group member skills, and acquire the principles and understandings to engage in a continuous cycle of team and individual improvement. Adaptive Schools is the “how” of professional learning communities: how to behave in groups, how to lead them, and how to facilitate them for improved leading, teaching, and learning. In the four-day Adaptive Schools Foundation Seminar, participants will develop: An increased capacity to initiate, develop and sustain high functioning groups. New lenses for diagnosing the stages and phases of group development. An expanded repertoire of practical facilitation tools. Understandings of when and how to engage groups in dialogue and discussion, the limitations, forms, and values of each. Skills to move groups beyond consensus to common focus. Ways to value and use dissension, argument, and conflict Strategies for keeping group members on track, on topic, energized and resourceful.

Brainspring Literacy - Phonics First

July 7- 11

Erie 1 BOCES Education Campus

Phonics First Level 1 is a multi-sensory training course designed for K-3 whole class and small group instruction, 4th-5th grade small groups, and K-5 special education and intervention (tiers 2 and 3). It equips teachers to implement Orton-Gillingham instruction, helping beginning and struggling readers, including those with dyslexia and learning disabilities, develop strong reading and spelling skills. Participants learn phonemic awareness, decoding and encoding strategies, structured review drills, tactile spelling techniques, syllabication methods, advanced spelling skills, and oral reading fluency.

The curriculum is evidence-informed and trauma sensitive.

Enhancing ELL Literacy: Science of Reading and Advanced Literacies

July 7 - August 1, 2025

Asynchronous - Virtual

Utilizing NYSED topic briefs, participants will explore advanced literacy strategies tailored for English Language Learners (ELLs), and gain understanding of the science of reading. Participants will then integrate their learning with The Reading League Summit's Joint Statement, "Understanding the Difference: The Science of Reading and Implementation for English Learners/Emergent Bilinguals (ELs/EBs). 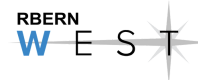


A Framework for Foundational Literacy Skills Instruction for English Learners

Based on how many modules are completed, participants may receive 3-6 CTLE credits. **Cost:** Free, not eligible for substitute reimbursement

This comprehensive and highly intensive multi-sensory training course qualifies teachers to bring Orton-Gillingham instruction into their classrooms. Phonics First transforms beginning and struggling reader, students who have dyslexia and/or learning disabilities into skilled learners through our effective, fun, multi-sensory approach to reading and spelling. **Cost:** \$1,750, eligible for substitute reimbursement

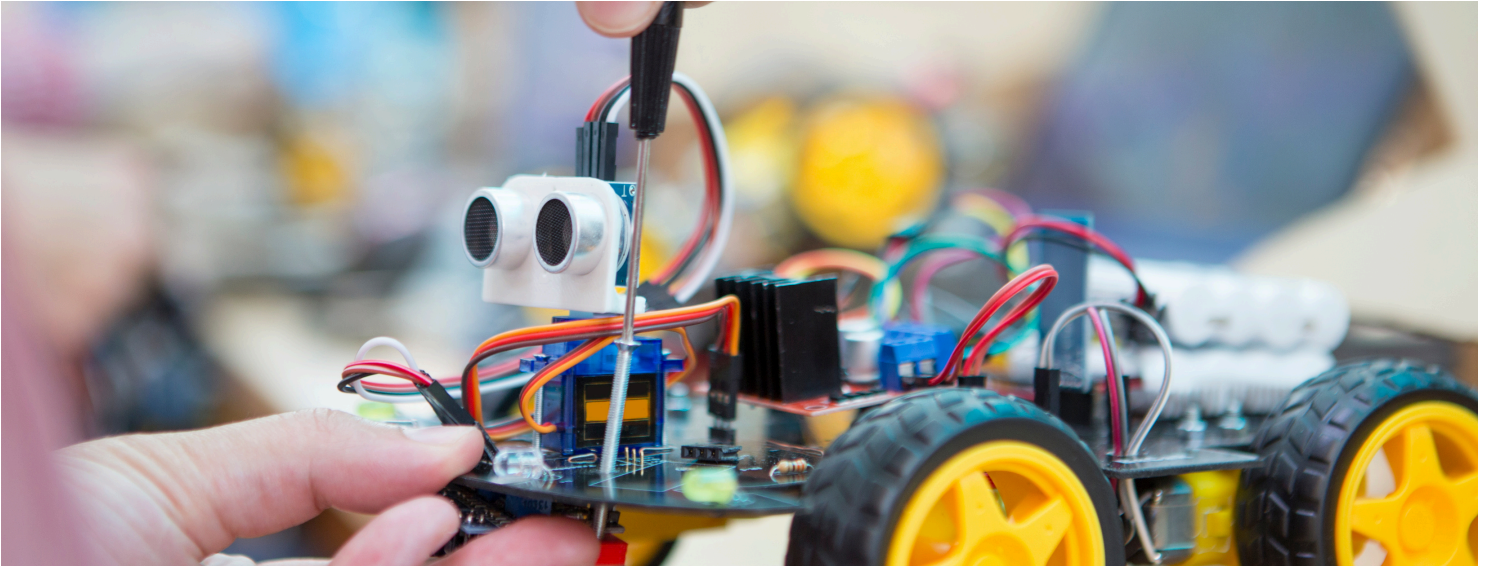

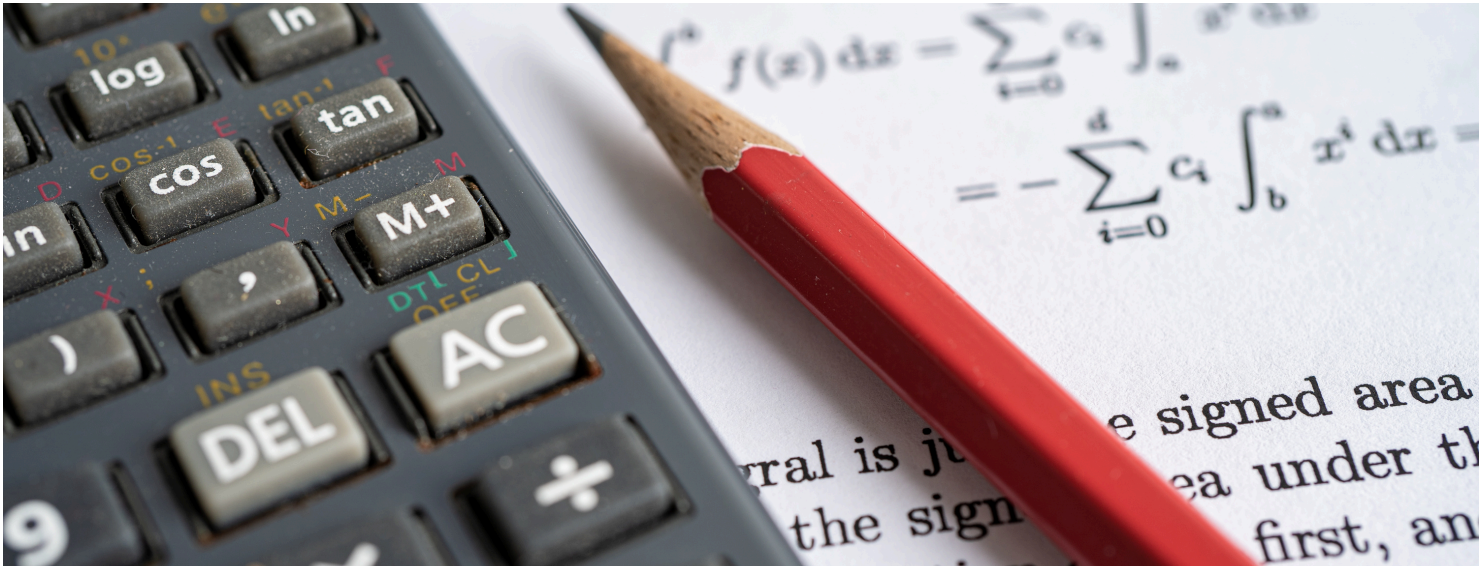

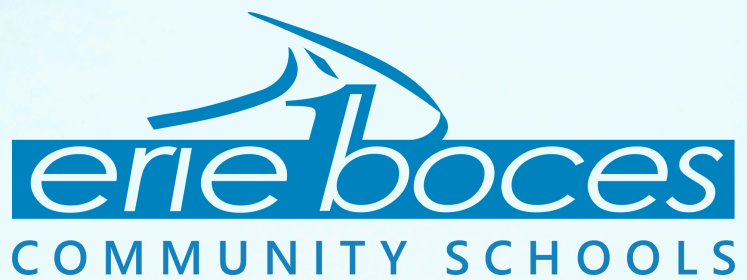
