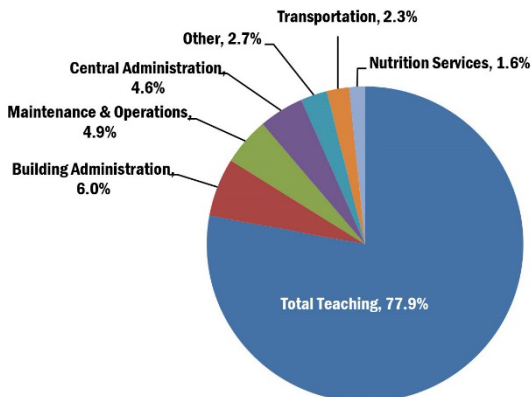

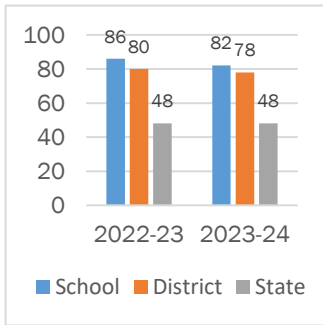
2023-24 School Goals

85% of students in grades 3-5 will respond favorably in their Sense of Belonging as measured by the Panorama Survey in the Spring of 2026.

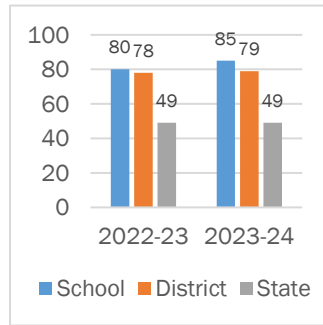

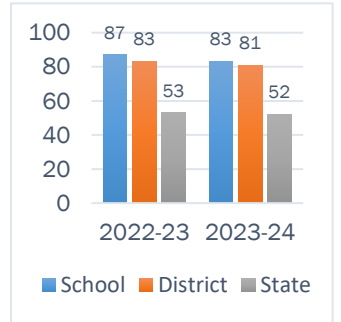
3rd Grade English Language Arts



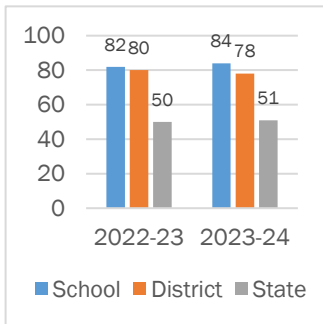
4th Grade English Language Arts



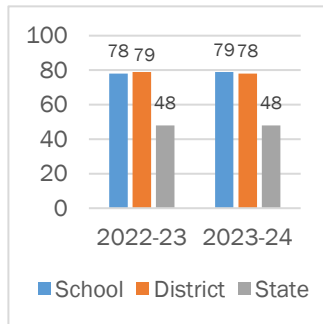
5th Grade English Language Arts



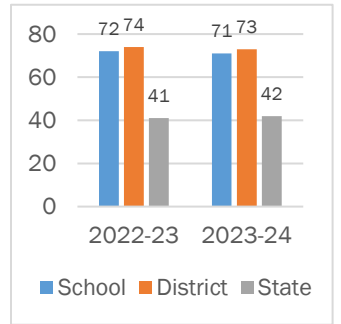
3rd Grade Math



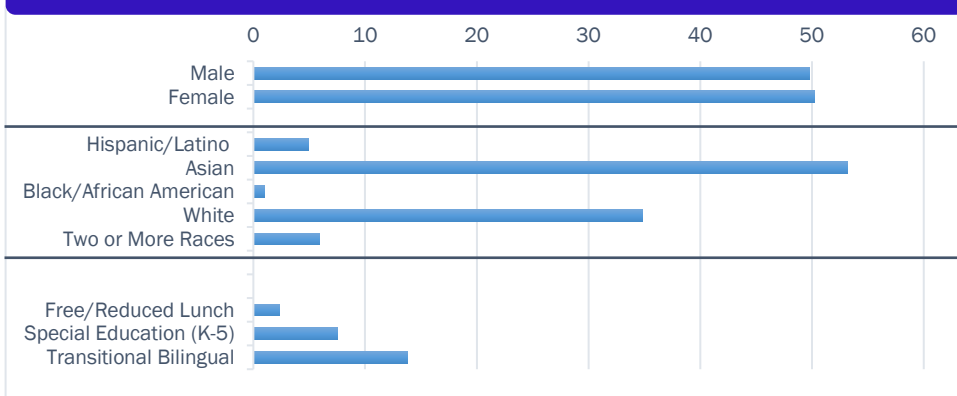
4th Grade Math
