What is Title I?

- A federal grant that helps disadvantaged students meet state academic content and performance standards.
- RUSD Title I Schools with a Free or Reduced Price Meal Rate of 60% or higher receive Title I funds for services at their site.
- In addition, some District level Title I services are provided to sites.
- Title I services supplement the base instructional program.

District Level (\$10,333,235 for 2024/25)


- Teachers on Special Assignment English Learner Students Focus

School Site Councils develop a School Plan that includes Title I services to support students achieve academically & become English proficient.



What is Title III?

- Federal grant that supports English Learner Students attain English Language Proficiency and meet state academic content and performance standards.
- Funds are not allocated to sites and services to students are coordinated by District staff.
 All schools receive services.
- Title III services supplement the base instructional program & Title I services.

- Title III Immigrant Student Program (\$112,051)
