
Reclassification


Reclassification is the process whereby a student is reclassified from English learner (EL) status to **Fluent English Proficient** (RFEP) status.

Preparing for Reclassification

- Criteria for reclassification is a collaborative effort between the state of California and school districts
- Exit criteria should be based on objective standards, like test scores
- Students should only exit English language development programs when they can speak, read, write, and comprehend English well enough to participate meaningfully in a school setting.
- School districts should monitor former ELs for four years after they are reclassified.



Before Reclassification



- Daily standards aligned instruction
- Daily English language development in an academic setting
- English Language Development Standards used in tandem with the CCSS for all subjects







English Language Development (ELD)

California requires two English Language Development programs to be implemented to support Multilingual learners learn English.



English Language Development (ELD)



- Taught during a protected time within the school day
- Lessons designed in ways that build into and from content and aligned to the ELD standards
- Develop the critical academic language needed by ELs for content learning





English Language Development (ELD)

Integrated ELD

- Throughout the day and across all subjects
- ELD/CCSS are taught in tandem to ensure students strengthen their abilities to use English as they simultaneously learn content through English
- Language clarification and language acquisition support




