All statements and/or questions shall be directed to the presiding officer and no participant may address or question Board members individually. All speakers are requested to express themselves in a civil manner, with due respect for the dignity and privacy rights of others whose legal rights may be affected.

Please note: While it is not the Board's intention to stifle comment on matters of legitimate concern to the school community, the public should be aware that if their statements violate the rights of others under the law governing defamation or invasion of privacy, they may face personal liability to the injured party.

If speakers are uncertain of the legal ramifications of their comments, the Board urges them to seek guidance beforehand from their own legal advisor

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Department of Education remains at the ready to assist every local educational agency (LEA) in returning to full-time, in-person instruction for school year (SY) 2025-2026. This includes providing LEAs with guidance in the event of declared emergencies resulting in a district-wide closure, and

WHEREAS, in April 2020, Governor Murphy issued an executive order that became P.L.2020, c.27. This law provides for the continuity of instruction in the event of a public-health related district closure so that LEAs can utilize virtual or remote instruction to satisfy the 180-day requirement pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:7F-9, and

WHEREAS, in order to provide transparency and ensure that New Jersey students continue to receive high quality, standards-based instruction, each school district, charter school, renaissance school project and Approved Private School for Students with Disabilities (APSSDs) must annually submit its proposed program for virtual or remote instruction (Plan) to the New Jersey Commissioner of Education, and

WHEREAS, this plan would be implemented during an LEA closure lasting more than three consecutive school days due to a declared state of emergency, declared public health emergency, or a directive by the appropriate health agency or officer to institute a public health-related closure, and

WHEREAS, LEAs must include the statutory and regulatory requirements listed in the "LEA Guidance for Chapter 27 Emergency Virtual or Remote Instruction Programs for the 2025-2026 SY" in plans for virtual or remote instruction for the 2025-2026 school year, and

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Bayonne Board of Education hereby approves the Emergency Virtual or Remote Instruction Program for the 2025-2026 school year, as presented.

WHEREAS, this Board of Education of the City of Bayonne, Hudson County, New Jersey deems it desirous to support the following unique learning opportunity for select Social Studies students at Bayonne H.S.:

- Four Bayonne High School students, Sincere Fraser Green (Isaiah), Julian Hanna, Bavly Beshai, and Youanna Sofian to become involved in the Youth Civic Engagement Project by acting as Research Assistants to Rutgers Political Scientist, Dr. Eric Davis. Under Director Dan Ward's supervision, students will help to create a database of youth organizations engaged in civic activities. Research Assistants will also develop an understanding of the 17 United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), 2015-2030. In time, the database will be transformed into a website. Rutgers University's Honors College may also help to develop the Youth Civic Engagement Project website. Students will work independently and collaboratively with one another to gather this information and transform it into a researchable database. After graduation in June 2025, students and Mr. Ward will meet virtually with Dr. Davis over the course of the summer to discuss their progress. This project will continue through the 2025 - 2026 academic year. Over the course of the year, students may visit the Rutgers campus to meet with Dr. Davis and to tour relevant facilities such as the Eagleton Institute. Annual visits will take place under the supervision of Mr. Ward.

WHEREAS, this Board of Education supports this initiative and understands that students and Mr. Ward will remain involved for the 2025-2026 school year, and therefore

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Board of Education approves of this educational opportunity for its students at no cost to the District.

RESOLUTION TO APPROVE THE NONPUBLIC EVERY STUDENT SUCCEEDS ACT (ESSA) PUBLIC LAW 114-95, **CHAPTER 192/193, TITLE I, and IDEA BASIC** AGREEMENT, BETWEEN BAYONNE BOARD OF EDUCATION AND MONMOUTH OCEAN EDUCATIONAL SERVICES COMMISSION (MOESC) FOR THE 2025-2026 SCHOOL YEAR

WHEREAS, this Board of Education of the City of Bayonne, Hudson County, New Jersey deems it necessary to provide Title III-Immigrant Services for nonpublic school students within the District; and

WHEREAS, the Monmouth Ocean Educational Services Commission (MOESC) has agreed to provide these services to eligible students who attend non-public schools in Bayonne; and

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education enter into an agreement with the Monmouth Ocean Educational Services Commission (MOESC) whereby the Commission will provide services during the 2025-2026 school year for those identified students who attend nonpublic schools in Bayonne; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that projected cost will be based on the most recent notification of the NJDOE setting forth anticipated aid to the Public School District. Invoices shall correspond to payments from the NJDOE. The cost of services provided by the Monmouth Ocean Educational Services Commission (MOESC) shall not exceed the funds provided by the state (Schools TBD); and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Board of Education moved that the recommendations of this Board of Education be adopted and that the President is authorized to execute the Contract with the Secretary on behalf of the Board and that the Board Counsel approve the Contract as to form, and/or that the School Business Administrator be authorized to issue Purchase Orders for same; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board President and Board Secretary sign and on behalf of this Board Counsel approve the same as to form. This resolution is effective immediately.
