



Transportation


Dress Code

- Collared Shirts: White, light blue, navy, black, yellow (light).

- Jumpers and Dresses: Black, Navy, Khaki


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

- Please walk down the sidewalk to pick your child up. Children will not be allowed to play on the grass on the hill as buses come down the drive quickly.






Breakfast/Lunch

Students will need

Voice Levels: 0 = silence 1 = whisper, between 2 people




Behavior Expectations

- Carmalt uses a Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports system referred to as being on FIRE!
- Students earn points each period for showing Friendliness, Integrity, Responsibility and Engagement
- Students can trade in their earned PBIS points for rewards
- This creates a positive and safe school environment so students can thrive academically and socially.



Expectations for Coming into Kindergarten

- Print their name on a line
- Be able to sing the "ABC" song
- Identify the letters in their name
- Know their phone number and address
- Identify the basic colors and shapes
- Count to 20
- Cut on a line with scissors
- Sit and listen to a story
- Grasp a pencil correctlyBe able to dress and undress themselves and zip and button coat
- Use the restroom on their own (boys-urinal)
- Start learning to tie their shoesBe able to clean up after themselves, particularly breakfast and lunch
- Follow two step directions



Academic Expectations

Leaving Kindergarten

- Count and write numbers to 100
- Add and subtract basic facts to 10
- Recognize 2 and 3-D shapes
- Recognize and know all letter sounds, and write them
- Read and spell 50 sight words
- Read, spell, and write basic CVC words
- Recall the main idea and details from a story
- Write a sentence independently
- Read a simple book independently
