BOYS

The boys won their second consecutive TVL Championship with a score of 180 points. There were eight individual TVL champions: Xavier Pawlowski (300), Tyler Thorngren (600 and 1000), Leo Wengert (1600), Avery Heretz (1600), Anthony Tobiasz (shot put), 4x400 meter relay (Bryan Badolato, Ethan Kidwell, Reid O'Bryan and Xavier Pawlowski) and the 4x800 meter relay (Bryan Badolato, Leo Wengert, Tyler Thorngren and Kyle Little).

The boys finished second place overall at the Section III Class AA Championship, with 106 points. There were two individual Section III champions: Xavier Pawlowski (300) and the 4x800 meter relay (Bryan Badolato, Leo Wengert, Tyler Thorngren and Kyle Little).

State Championship Meet

On March 8, Anthony Tobiasz and Xavier Pawlowski competed at the NYSPHSAA/NYS Federation Indoor Track and Field Championships at Ocean Breeze Athletic Complex in Staten Island.

Xavier Pawlowski competed in the 300-meter dash. He finished in 17th place overall with a time of 35.41, which is the second fastest time in school history.

Anthony Tobiasz competed in shot put. He finished 15th place overall with a throw of 49-5. During the meet, Anthony was honored with the 2024-2025 NYSPHSAA Section III Sportsmanship Award. The award is voted on by the Section III Indoor Track Committee and is awarded to the student-athlete who exemplifies sportsmanship qualities throughout the season.

The girls finished the TVL Championship in third place overall, with 83 points. There were three individual TVL champions: Lana Moore (1000), Sophia Celia (high jump) and the 4x800 meter relay (Kylie Murray, Lana Moore, Angelina Levkovets and Sophia Celia).

The girls finished fifth place overall at the Section III Class AA Championship with 40 points. The team had one individual Section III champion: Kylie Murray (1000).

BOYS SCHOOL RECORDS BROKEN THIS YEAR:

Anthony Tobiasz broke two school records this year. He broke the weight throw record on December 28, 2024 with a throw of 53-10. He broke the shot put record on February 25, 2025 with a throw of 52-6.5.

On February 25, 2025, the 4x800 meter relay team broke the school record with a team of Bryan Badolato, Leo Wengert, Kyle Little and Tyler Thorngren, and a time of 8:46.34.




Whitesboro Varsity Boys and Girls 2024-2025 NORDIC SKI SEASON SUMMARY



The girls volleyball team had a mix of returners and young players (six sophomores and a freshman) for the 2024-25 season. After a 2-3 start, they improved their record to 9-5 before the last week of the season. The team lost the last three games to the top three teams, but each one was a battle. They received a #6 seed and had to travel to #3 seed (and defending Class B champs) CBA of Syracuse. They came out of that match with a 3-1 victory to advance to the semifinals. That victory moved them up to #4 in the power rankings (they were not ranked all season). The team lost in a hard fought match to the eventual champions, RFA. They finished the season 10-9, with a lot of confidence going into next year. Team captains were Adeline Melnick, Erin Howlett, Olivia Maynard and Madison Sheridan.

Vrestling 2024–2025 SEASON SUMMARY

The Whitesboro wrestling team had a very successful season. The captains for the 2024-25 team were Ryan Burt, Joey Dare and Noah Long. Each were given the unselfish role to lead their wrestling brothers.

The team competed in two invitational tournaments during the year. During their first tournament, at the Phoenix Round Robin, the team finished in third place in a field of 18 teams with four finalists: Ethan Roser taking first and Joey Dare, Noah Long, and Ryan Burt taking second. At the Cazenovia Invitational, the team took home second place out of a field of 16. The team had five in the finals: Nick Puleo, Ethan Roser, Joey Dare, Noah Long and Ryan Burt, with Ethan being the lone champion.

The team also competed in multiple dual meet tournaments. The first was the Baldwinsville duals, and against a field of 10 teams, they placed fourth. Nicholas Puleo went 5-0 that day and was awarded the Most Outstanding Wrestler for Whitesboro. The team also competed in the Mt. Markham Mustang duals. The team wrestled 10 dual meets over two days. They ended up with seven wins and three losses, placing fourth. With Joey Dare going 10-0, he was awarded Whitesboro's MOW. Finally, they competed at the West Genesee Wildcats dual meet tournament, finishing in fourth place. Giovanni Lang was the MOW for Whitesboro, finishing the day at 5-0.

On January 22, the team held its Senior Night against South Lewis. Seniors Gayge Amrhein, Anthony Chicherchia, Ryan Burt, Colin Nelson and Samuel Perras were honored. A week later, junior Joey Dare received his 100th win of his career in a dual meet with CVA.

The team finished with a 15-16 record in dual matches, after a 12-6 start. Hampered by sickness and injuries in late January, the team struggled to keep pace with the success they had in the beginning of the year, but overcame it all to get ready for the sectionals.

In the postseason, the team headed to Fulton to wrestle in the Section III Class A tournament. Ten Whitesboro wrestlers entered Class A, and by the end of the day, nine had qualified for the Section III Division 1 tournament (state qualifiers). The team took fourth place out of a field of nine teams, giving Whitesboro its best placing in five years. The team had three wrestlers in the finals: Ethan Roser (second), Joey Dare (first) and Noah Long (second), with Joey being the lone Class A champion. In the finals, he revenged a lost against a competitor from Watertown, who he had lost to earlier in the season. Others who placed and qualified for sectionals were Giovanni Lang (third), RJ Allen (fourth), Nick Puleo (fourth), Gayge Amrhein (fifth) and Ryan Burt (fifth).

At the Section III tournament, held at the SRC Arena at Onondaga Community College, the team advanced nine wrestlers to wrestle against the best competition in the section. When it was all said and done, the team tied for 10th place out of a field of 18. Five Whitesboro wrestlers were sectional place finishers: Joey Dare (third), Noah Long (fourth), Gio Lang (fifth), Ethan Roser (sixth) and Gayge Amrhein (sixth).
