Mrs. Chapman provided the legislative update. Senate Bill 155, Cell Phone Ban, passed in the Senate last week And will go to the House, then the Governor. It would require all public schools to adopt policies prohibiting cell Phone use during instruction. The following bills are in Committee Review: HB 262, Natural Family Month; SB 34, Historical Documents Bill; SB 113/HB 155, DEI ban; and HB 97/SB 109, Free Meals Program. The Following bills are under consideration: HB 42, Immigration data collection; SB 107/HB 153, Partisan School Board Races; HB 145, Extended school year; SB 68, Educational Savings Accounts; HB 190, Given Name Act, SB 156/ HB 269, Success Sequence Curriculum; HB 191, Teacher minimum salary; SB 127, School closure authority; HB 114, Kindergarten age requirements. Senate Bill 1 passed and was signed by the governor, and a petition is underway. It needs 250,00 signatures from 44 counties to appear on the November ballot.

Legislative Update G-3 Minute 1:41:23

Mr. Mack reported on the Safety and Security Committee and recent upgrades to district. Grant money in the Amount of \$496,000 supported the purchases of safety measures. Mrs. Farris reported on the Finance Committee, where Mrs. Rowe discussed the biannual budget bill and the five year forecast. Mrs. Chapman addressed having a student on the Board of Education.
