

Music Scholarship Audition Requirements 11+

Composition

Performance

One piece on main instrument only – please refer to the set pieces for your appropriate instrument.

Composition Portfolio:

- 2 contrasting original compositions of any style
- Max length 3 mins per piece
- You may bring these on manuscript paper or on software on a laptop or similar device
- Please be prepared to either perform your piece or play a recording (which can be from notation software) during the interview

What we are looking for: A technical understanding of harmony, melody, texture and structure used in a creative way to create pieces which flow effectively, have a consistent sense of style and a balance of contrast and repetition.

Composition Technical study

During your warm up you will be given a short composition task to work on in the 20 minutes preparation time. You will be given a short 4 note motif and asked to create a short composition (between 30 secs to 1 minute) to perform to us on the piano or your instrument during the interview. This can be notated in any way you like.

The piece will be of approximately grade 3 standard and you will be able to play it through and write any notes you need on the copy we give you.

What we are looking for: A creative response to the motif showing a sense of development and character. We are not expecting a finished and fully notated composition.

Aural tests

We will give you some short aural tests, similar in style to the ABRSM aural for your corresponding grade.

What we are looking for: We want you to be able to show us what you can hear and how you understand the music you hear.

Interview

We will talk to you about your current music making, your musical ambitions, your wider interests and hobbies. We want to find out more about you -there will be no trick questions!

What we are looking for: Our music scholars are passionate and serious about their music making, they enjoy the challenge of the music we work on together, and they work closely as a team with each other and with staff. We are looking for musicians who share that drive, who will fit into our team and who will be role models.
