The Regular Meeting of the Osborn School District Governing Board was called to order at 5:30 p.m. by Board President Flamand.

Montecito Administrator Ms. Pierson shared a presentation highlighting the Montessori, Changemakers and SEAS programs all located at Montecito Community School. Providing an overview of each of program, she said each program chose a focus for the year and shared examples of how each focus area is being exemplified in their respective programs.

<u>District Celebrations and Announcements</u> Point of Pride Recipients from Encanto

Ms. Pierson introduced Point of Pride recipients Primitiva Rose-Certified Staff, Aisha Thomas-Classified Staff and Marlena McCormack and Socks-who volunteer through Gabriel's Angels. After introducing each of the recipients, she congratulated and presented them with a pin and certificate.

Dr. Robert shared that through a grant the district recently received 1,200 COVID tests. Because the tests are for unrestricted use, they may be used for community and staff as needed. He also shared that Solano has been selected as a drive thru Embry Health site.

He then expressed his appreciation of the Osborn School District Education Foundation and their support of the district. In addition to the beverage truck that visited each site providing delivered beverages to each staff member along with a lanyard, Spring Mini Grants totaling \$4,200 have been awarded to teachers, and the Teachers of the Year program will resume with winners being recognized in the fall.

Call to the Public

Dr. Kristy Osgood introduced herself as a former and current Girl Scout Leader and requested members reconsider their decision and allow the Girl Scouts meetings to take place on campus. She shared ways the troop has supported the district and said it has been difficult for the girls to meet online.

Community member Pam Pawlowski shared that she is a resident of the Grandview neighborhood and has been working on getting a 4 way stop in the area. She explained that 2 years ago residents celebrated a hawk light in the area, but as more kids are being picked up and dropped off, the neighborhood has seen an increase in traffic, adding that with additional housing multi- family units being built more traffic is expected. in the area. She said residents of the area support adding the stop, and they are hoping to have support of the Governing Board as well.

Andrew Feight said that as a community member, he was glad to see the Board discussing Encanto Clarendon Safe Routes to School. He expressed support of the project and said the neighborhood is proud to have the school as part of the community.

Board Presentation

Encanto/Clarendon Safe Routes to Schools

Mr. Hermes shared that there is a formal committee working on this project who share a concern about safety. The committee has been meeting since May and has connected with the ASU Council of Health Solutions.

Dr. Allison Ross and Pamela Kulinna presented findings from their data collection citing several issues including speed limits, volume of traffic and sidewalk conditions. Discussion took place about parent surveys that indicated about 15 percent of parents living in the community drive their children to school even though it takes more time than those who use other modes of

transportation. Dangerous intersections and too much traffic were noted as reasons families don't walk to bike.

The City is looking at making adjustments including the possibility of adding a 4-way stop however Dr. Ross noted that the City cannot add a 4-way stop and designate the area a school zone so a resolution has not been reached.

Community member Jonathon expressed his appreciation of the Board in bringing this forward noting that he has seen the dangers on Osborn Road firsthand. Dr. Christy Osgood agreed, stating that they have asked for help but the situation is not getting better.

Discussion moved to next steps with the probability of a resolution being brought to the Board from the committee, as well as steps that would allow the district to make improvements without needing approval from the City and utilizing the \$100,000 earmarked from a grant award for this project.

Native American Coordinator Amber Stevens provided an overview of the classes Living in Two Worlds and Speak Up Be Safe that would be provided by the Phoenix Indian Center with this agreement and includes classes for both students and adults. Ms. Corbin stated the importance of respecting and trusting each other reminding that each member has something different to offer but it is all for the same purpose, helping students.

Mr. Hermes appreciated the presentation about Montecito expressing excitement about seeing the school grow. He loved seeing the support and presentations on Safe Routes and would like more people comfortable walking to school.

President Flamand enjoyed the public participation and looks forward to resuming activities that present more opportunities for community access to schools. He also appreciates the opportunity with the Phoenix Indian Center.

Dr. Robert expressed appreciation of the work being done in the programs at Montecito and the discussion around safety.
