### **District Updates**

*Elementary – Kim Kuchar*

Ms. Kuchar reported that the elementary school had a lot of celebrations in March including a literacy night and the Pre-K art show, which were both great turnouts and successes. March is Reading Month which includes lunchtime drawings, guest readers in classrooms, and national joke day. Ms. Kuchar then went over the Fall/Winter Reading and Math data - 65% proficient/grade level. Professional development day was on March 14<sup>th</sup> with a shout out to Mrs. Cervoni, Mrs. Gillet/Mrs. Severn, Mr. Skinner and Mrs. Knieper for presenting on data analysis and M-Step Proctor training. Upcoming events include the Parent Kindergarten meeting on March 19<sup>th</sup>, PTO talent show on March 20<sup>th</sup>, T2 Pride Assembly on March 27<sup>th</sup> with Pride drawings thanks to the PTO, boys vs. staff basketball game. The book vending machine launch, those who went to literacy night received a token for the machine.

### *High School- Drew Severn*

Mr. Severn reported on FFA State competition updates, Junior High Conduct of Meetings-6<sup>th</sup> place silver; Parliamentary procedure- 4<sup>th</sup> place gold; Greenhand Speaking-Brooklyn Bowns - 2<sup>nd</sup> place gold runner up; Greenhand conduct of meetings- state winner gold; Ag Science Fair-Alexis Andres - state winner; Proficiency Award-Sara Dammann- state winner; Proficiency Award-Alexis Andres - state winner; Academic Excellence - 3 gold awards; Outstanding Jr Award- 9 students; State FFA degree - 7 students; Washington Leadership Scholarship-Sean Dammann; National Chapter gold award (top ten in state); Crop contest- state runner up; and 3 students served as delegates. Mr. Severn then reported a robotics update- congratulations to our New Lothrop Stingers who competed at Wayne State University in Detroit over the weekend in the First Robotics Competition. The Stingers took 3<sup>rd</sup> place overall and claimed the Industrial Design Award. FFA labor auction raised \$34,000, special thanks to all involved. Mr. Severn presented the data for i-READY/EWIMS. The high school is preparing for the upcoming PSAT/SAT state assessment, testing window will begin April 9<sup>th</sup>. All the test proctors trained during March PD. Upcoming events include Mock Rock (celebrating 40 years) on March 21<sup>st</sup>, NHS Induction March 26<sup>th</sup> at 7pm, FFA Spring Skills Contest April 11<sup>th</sup>, Honors luncheon April 22<sup>nd</sup>, FFA banquet April 27<sup>th</sup> and Spring band concert on April 30<sup>th</sup>.

### *Athletics - Marty Weese*

Mr. Weese reported our March Tri County Athlete of the Month was Kevin Heslip. The Kiwanis Athlete of the month for the month of February was Dalton Birchmeier, Dalton will be voted upon by the Kiwanis Club for Athlete of the Year and announced in May Kiwanis Banquet. The Varsity individual regional tournament took place at St. Louis HS, Blake Wendling at 113# earned 3<sup>rd</sup> place; Hunter Wolfe at 126# earned 2<sup>nd</sup> place; Kyler Campbell at 144# earned 4<sup>th</sup> place and Dalton Birchmeier at 150# was regional champion. State finals Blake Wendling at 113# earned 7<sup>th</sup> place and Dalton Birchmeier at 150# earned 2<sup>nd</sup> place.
