Charleston, SC - As part of its efforts to ensure kids have access to breakfast and lunch meals during the summer months, Charleston County School District (CCSD) announced that 47 “open” sites – including nine Charleston County Public Library branches -- will be serving no-cost summer meals to kids and teens throughout Charleston County.
