Schools will involve parents in the planning, review, and improvement of the parent and family engagement plan.

At the annual Title 1 Parent Meeting, the P & F Engagement plan will be presented, reviewed, and approved by all stakeholders.

Schools will provide parents timely information about programs, description and explanation of the curriculum, monitoring progress, academic assessments, achievement levels of the State

academic standards, and opportunities for regular meetings/ parent conferences for parents to be involved in the decisions relating to the education of their children.

Schools will jointly develop with parents a school-parent compact that states how parents, school, and students will share responsibility for improved student academic achievement by building and developing a partnership to help children achieve the State's high standards.

Tidehaven Intermediate Parent Compact was edited in August 2020 to include Remote Learners, and will be reviewed and revised again at the end of the current academic year.

Schools will provide opportunities for parents and family members (limited English proficiency, disabled, migrant) and provide information in a format and language parents understand.
