Board President Lisa Herbert welcomed everyone to the Special meeting. It is in a special place where we will unveil the new and exciting Senior Café – the Nordic Nook. We will also be celebrating the academic and athletic achievements of our students.

At 7:33 p.m., the President of the Board of Education re-opened the Public Session. As the first order of business, Board President Lisa Herbert led the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Superintendent Dr. Adele Pecora advised that they would be doing the ribbon-cutting on the Nordic Nook. She went on to briefly speak about the history of the room and Assistant Superintendent for Business and Operations, Andrew Casale's vision of what the room could become. Mr. Casale and High School Principal, Nicole Schnabel, presented the idea for this space. Dr. Pecora went on to talk about the finished space and how the students will be able to use and enjoy. Student Danielle Hausfeld – Question: How fast-moving technology affects people now and in the future. She explained her focus was on feelings/emotions and real-life problems. She showed four pieces of art, explaining what she was trying to say in each. She also spoke about the mediums used – acrylic and oil, which is her strong suit, and colored pencils.

Student Paige Holt Question: How can I depict fear of change through facial expressions. Paige showed two pieces of art, one of which took about 9 ½ hours to complete and the entire piece was done with just printing paper, a bic pen and gel pen, grasping the feel of adding different textures into one art piece. The other piece shown created on a giant canvas was done entirely in pencil besides the marker showing the hint of change in technology.

Seaford High School Principal Nicole Schnabel spoke about the Nordic Nook and how proud and appreciative of everyone and all the work involved in making it happen. She then spoke about the CDP Program which has a Business class that runs the Viking Cold Café which they run from our school store. They have run what has become a really successful business operation this school year selling their treats and keeping everyone caffeinated. With the opening of the Nordic Nook, they will be shifting what they sell to help promote a new product that will also be facilitated through the Nordic Nook. One of the items they have helped us create through their business plan in their business course is a mug which they will be selling. The Nook will be giving a discount to anyone using their re-fillable mug instead of a cup.

Ms. Schnabel also announced that they had received news recently that Paige Holt was just noted as Outstanding Senior by the Science Teachers' Association of New York State Organization.

Each student who presented this evening was given a tumbler which can be used at the Nordic Nook.
