District Happenings:

- Amanda Howard, a kindergarten teacher at Long Neck Elementary School, was named the Indian River School District's Teacher of the Year for 2025-2026. The announcement was made at the district's annual Teacher of the Year ceremony on May 8 at the Seed and Sapling events venue in Frankford.
- Home Access Center will be discontinued on **June 25, 2025** due to the State of Delaware's transition to the Infinite Campus student information system. A new web-based portal that will give parents access to registration, scheduling, attendance, assignment and grade information for their children will be launched in mid-July.

Major Capital Improvement Progress:

- At the new Sussex Central High School, sitework on the courtyard, main entrance and ballfields is continuing.
- Paving was scheduled to begin once school dismissed for the year.
- Office and classroom flooring is complete and touch-up painting is continuing in the classroom wing and stairwells.
- Moving was scheduled to begin on June 17.
- The building remains on schedule for a September 2025 opening.

Carver Consent Order Update:

- The Community Advisory Board met on June 5 at the Howard T. Ennis School.
- The final quarterly update on former Carver Academy students was due at the end of the school year.
- The district continues to monitor its plans to address disproportionality in discipline and graduation rates.

- Madison Hogsten, a teacher of 4-year-olds at the IRSD Early Learning Center, has been awarded the Early Career Educator Award through the Delaware Institute for Excellence in Early Childhood.
