Highly Capable Program District Plan

Submitted annually to OSPI

The district's plan for students who are highly capable shall be annually approved by formal action of the district's board of directors.



Definition

Highly capable students perform or show potential for performing at significantly advanced levels compared to others of their age, experiences, or environments. Exceptional abilities are seen within students' general intellectual aptitudes, specific academic abilities, and/or creative productivities within a specific domain.

2023 Legislative Report Guidance

Key Highlights:

- Offer universal screening two times:
 - Once in or before 2nd grade
 - Again in or before 6th grade
- Services centered on 'enhanced instruction' and/or 'accelerated learning'
- Data accessible to the public

ISD Identification Process

Multiple measures include academic, cognitive, and creativity assessments:

- Iowa Test of Basic Standards (ITBS)
- i-Ready
- Cognitive Abilities Aptitude Test (CogAT)
- Torrance Test of Creative Thinking (TTCT)

 - Pull out 1-2 hours a week
 - · Content area services in reading and/or math
- Mind Education Right Left Integration (MERLIN) grades 3-5
 - Self-contained classrooms at Apollo and Endeavour

2025-2028 Goal Areas
