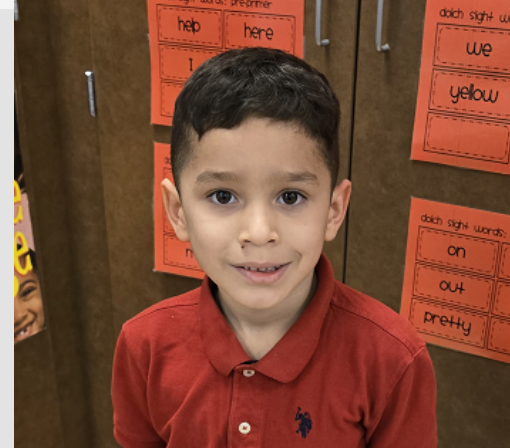

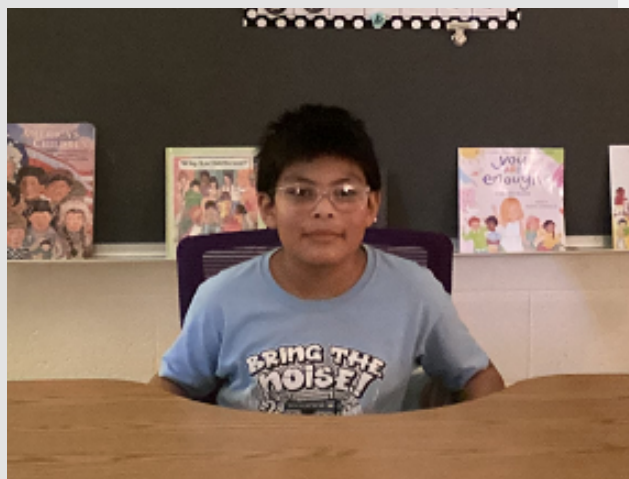

CREC

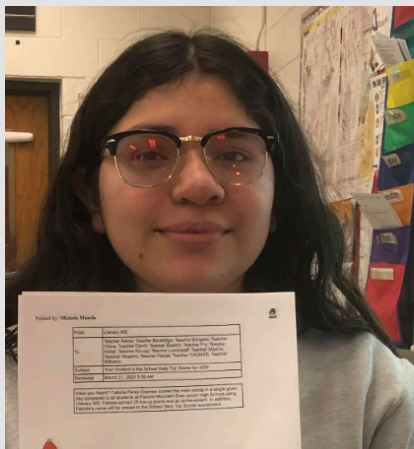

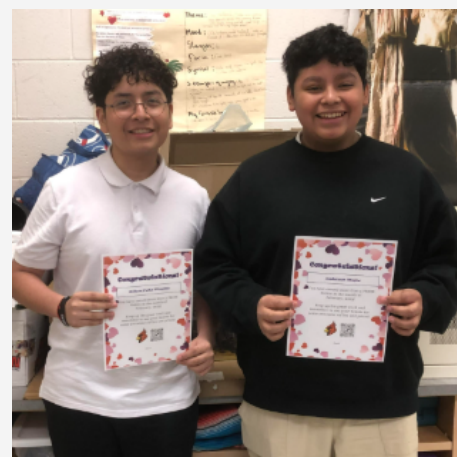
7th grader, Darleen Hernandez shows off yet another great Achieve 3000 certificate. This time Darleen scored high points for her performance on the Respond questions.
