Principal's Message

KAYA AND WANJU. HELLO AND WELCOME TO OUR 2024 ANNUAL REPORT FOR ALL SAINTS' COLLEGE (ASC), OUR FREMANTLE CAMPUS, THE STUDIO SCHOOL (TSS) AND OUR CHILDCARE, LITTLE SAINTS.

2024 saw ASC celebrate its 43rd birthday, and TSS enjoy a most successful third year.

The year saw us launch at ASC a new Strategic Plan (2024 – 2028). *Boordakan Dandju* sets for us an exciting and innovative set of projects under three headings:

- An innovative, creative and human-centred education;
- A nurturing and connective community, and;
- Active sustainability.

We also launched our new pedagogical statement, Generative Education, (more commonly known as Gen ED): a document that defines our unique framework for a values-driven and holistic pedagogy and curriculum committed to developing the whole person. Gen ED recognises that, beyond being passive consumers of knowledge, our students are active co-creators, critical and creative thinkers, and ethical young people committed to making a positive difference in our world.

On that, both campuses forged ahead in their New Metrics work – a world-leading project committed to explicitly teaching, assessing and reporting on the competencies as part of our commitment to knowing and developing the whole person. We were delighted to see students across both campuses recognised this year by receiving credentials from the University of Melbourne as a result of this groundbreaking work in which all our staff are engaged.

Our highly diverse student population sees us recognising that there are as many measures of success as there are students across our campuses.



Having said that, we began the year, as always, by acknowledging one of our many measures of success – the academic achievements of our graduating class in the ATAR examinations: they were, once again, simply outstanding and a fitting reward for the hard work of those students who chose to pursue the ATAR pathway.

The governance of both schools remained strong and consistent under the leadership of Board Chair, Mr Gary Mack, and we thank Gary and all members of our wonderful skills-based Board for the generosity with which they share their expertise and time.

We were thrilled to welcome in 2024 almost 1,320 students on to our Bull Creek (Gabbiljee) campus, and 115 students at our micro-school in Fremantle (Walyalup). Further, and for the first time ever, we welcomed our Little Saints to Waabiny, our Childcare for children aged 12 months to three years, which we opened this year.

None of our many achievements across 2024 would have been possible without the prudent management of our resources – a responsibility we all feel keenly as part of our ongoing commitment to the best interests of current and future generations of students.

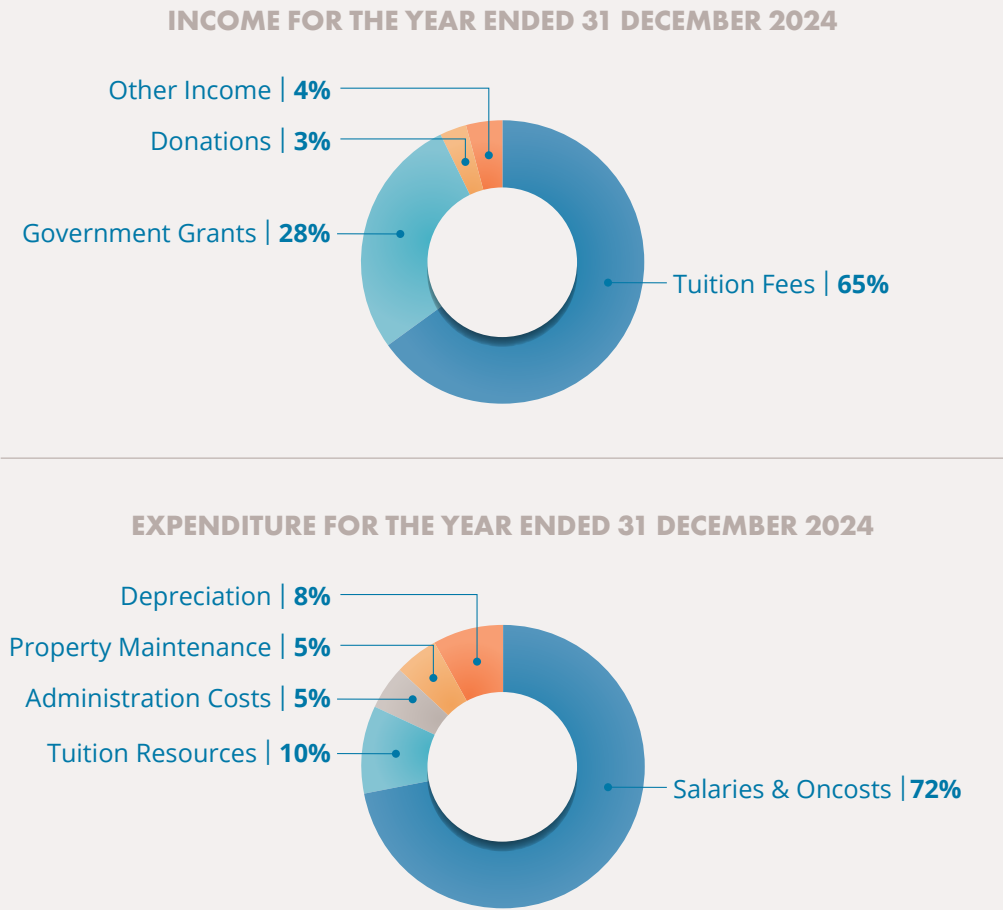

Financial Results

Enrolments through 2024 remained strong, especially at The Studio School, which saw a 32% increase compared to 2023, creating a small surplus for the year – its third year of operations. Revenue from tuition fees increased by 17% from 2023, on the back of higher enrolments at both the Bull Creek and Fremantle Campuses. Salary expenses continue to be the major cost to the College at 72% of total expenditure, which is in line with 2023. Insurance, ICT, wellbeing programs, energy and maintenance and servicing costs all experienced year-on-year increases above CPI.

During the year, the College completed the construction of Little Saints Childcare, which opened in July 2024. Additionally, the College commenced the new Science Extension project, which is expected to open in Term 2, 2025.

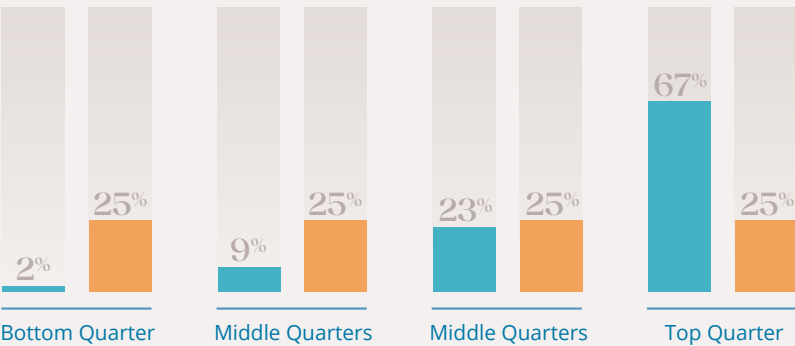

DISTRIBUTION OF SOCIO-EDUCATIONAL ADVANTAGE (SEA)



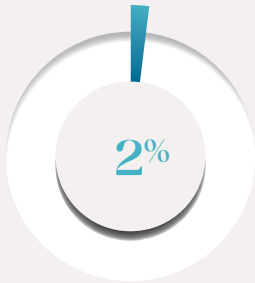

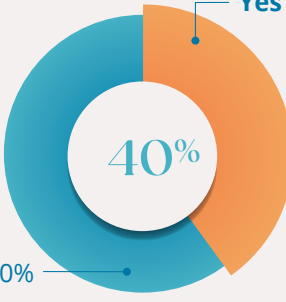

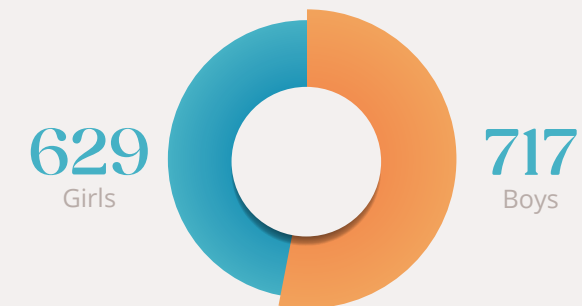

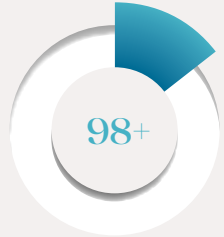

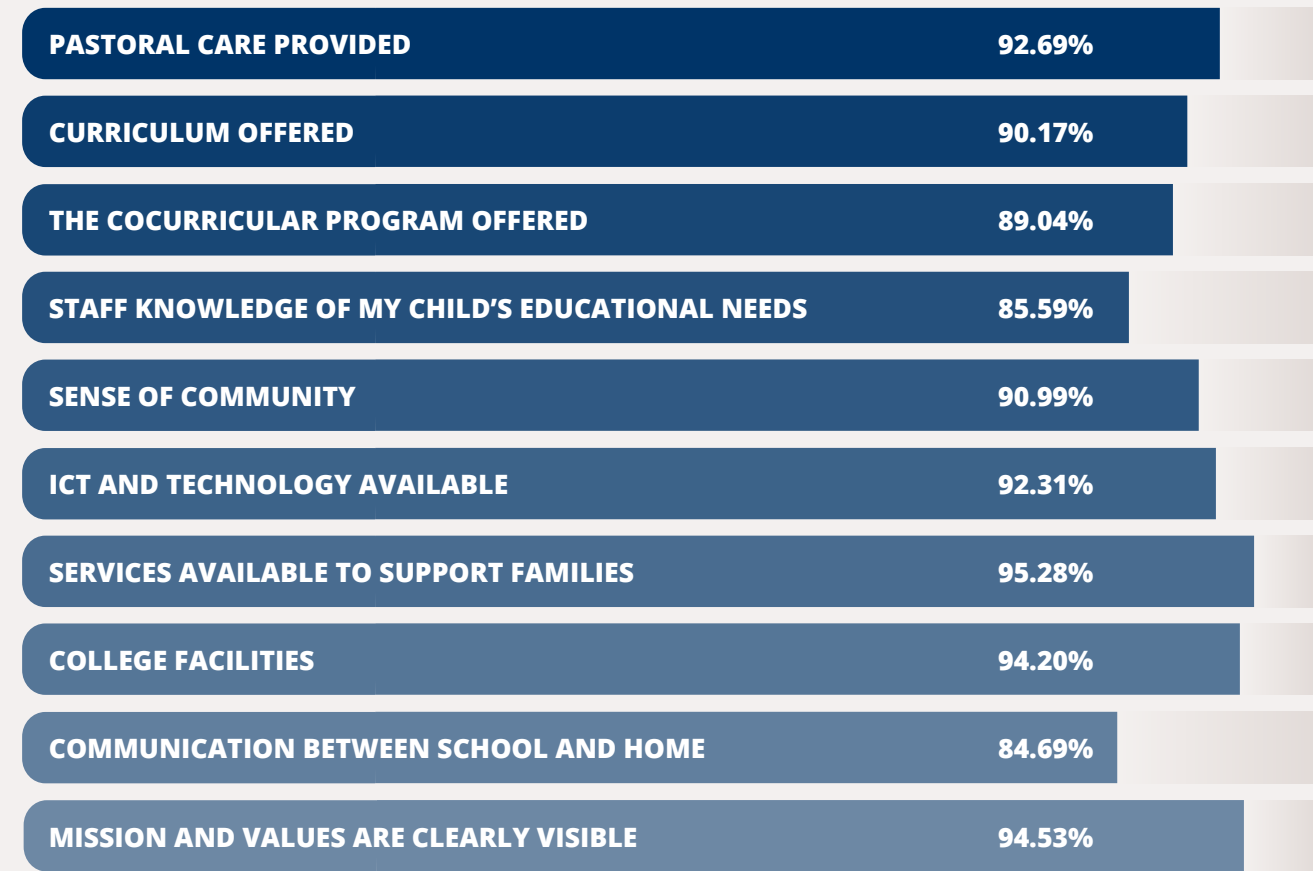

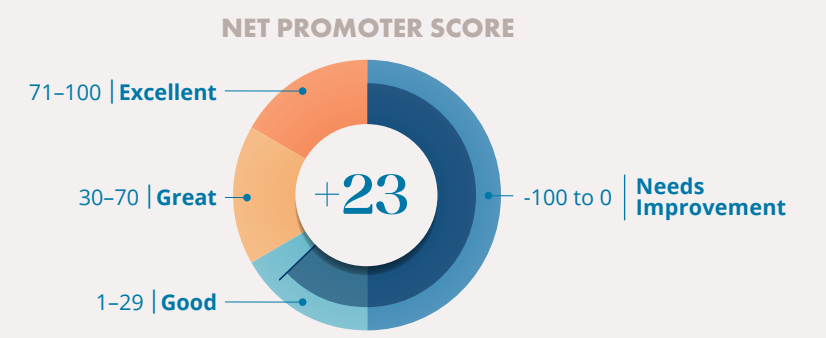

Head of Campus Message

AS I REFLECT ON 2024, MY FIRST YEAR AS HEAD OF CAMPUS AT THE STUDIO SCHOOL, I AM REMINDED OF THE STRENGTH AND RESILIENCE OF OUR LEARNING COMMUNITY. THIS HAS BEEN A YEAR OF GROWTH – NOT JUST IN NUMBERS, BUT IN RELATIONSHIPS, STUDENT ACHIEVEMENTS, AND A DEEPENING OF CONNECTION TO OUR PLACE IN WALYALUP.

We began the year by welcoming our largest ever Year 10 cohort. Their arrival reshaped the School processes in energising and unexpected ways, prompting our older students to rise to the occasion – mentoring, leading, and making space for our new students. Our Year 12s, many of whom were foundation students, stood out as calm, compassionate leaders throughout this transition.

Student agency remains at the centre of our culture. Across the year, students immersed themselves into projects that were both ambitious and deeply meaningful. Whether it was investigating the physics of surfboards or train lines, creating original digital games, leading mental health campaigns, or starting small businesses – students directed their learning with curiosity and purpose. These projects were the centre of our Project Showcases, hosted throughout the year and attended by our whole community, including industry mentors and project partners.

Service to community was another core thread through the year. Our ongoing work with residents of Silver Chain and Aegis aged care facilities, our support of local 'Friends of' groups – including Cantonment Hill and Booyeembara Park, and support for support services like St Pat's and Good Sammy – meant that students engaged in a range of meaningful, place-based service opportunities. A particularly significant moment was our Cambodia service tour, where a group of TSS students travelled to Cambodia alongside ASC students and staff to help build homes for families in need.

Closer to home, our Booyeembara Park project deepened connections with the Fremantle community. Through a City of Fremantle Youth Grant, students co-designed a revitalised Six Seasons Garden in Booyeembara Park in collaboration with local elders, artists, and the Booyeembara Friends Group. The community celebration organised by TSS students – complete with a yarnning circle, clay workshops, and native planting – was a highlight of the year, and a moving example of intergenerational learning.

This year marked solid progress in our continued involvement with the New Metrics project, in partnership with the University of Melbourne. TSS staff have been focused on embedding assessment practices that recognise the capabilities students will need in their future working lives – skills like collaboration, problem-solving, and communication. In 2024, we formally credentialled three students using the New Metrics framework, and we are planning to broaden this work in 2025 to include a larger group of students across different year levels.

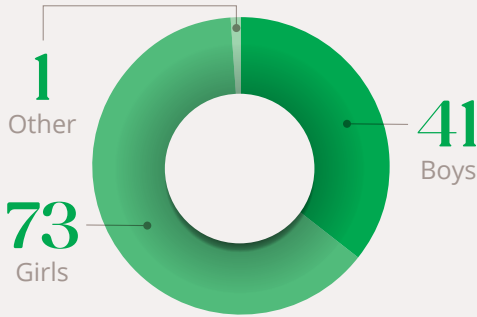

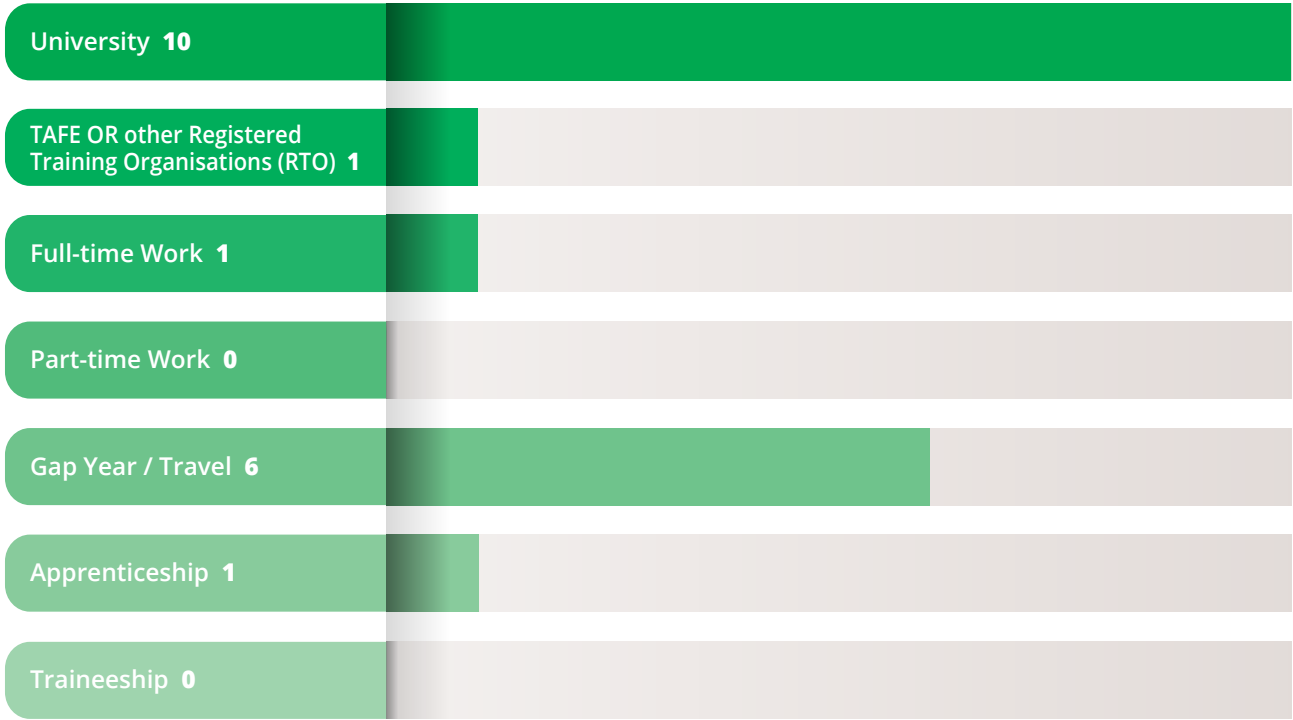

Director's Message

WHAT AN EXCITING YEAR IT HAS BEEN FOR LITTLE SAINTS AS WE WELCOMED OUR YOUNGEST LEARNERS TO THE COMMUNITY.

In June, we employed our wonderful foundation team of educators and, on 16 July, we were delighted to officially open the doors of Waabiny to welcome our very first little explorers. Waabiny – a Noongar word for 'play', is the perfect name for our state-of-the-art, purpose-built building. In early 2024, the finishing touches were still being added to this exciting new space. As the year drew to a close, Waabiny became alive with laughter, curiosity and connection, and is a joyful home for our Little Saints and their families.

Bringing Little Saints to life has been carefully supported by the Waabiny Project team, made up of key members of College staff. In April 2024 we welcomed our inaugural staff members: Kylie Chatto, Assistant Director of Junior School (Education and Care) and Tania Mulé, Little Saints Coordinator. With big hearts and big ideas, Kylie and Tania have been instrumental in turning plans into a buzzing reality.

Committed to growing in a sustainable and thoughtful manner, 2024 saw us open three of our five rooms. In the Weebill Room, named after Australia's smallest urban bird, we welcomed our littlest of Little Saints – children aged 12 months to 2 years. We also welcomed our first cohort of Willy Wagtail children (2 to 3 years), followed by our confident little chatterboxes in the Magpie Room (also 2 to 3 years), just a touch older and a touch louder! Each room has its own personality, just like the children who fill them.

As we welcomed our Little Saints, it has been exciting to see the ideas of the All Saints' College Junior School students come to life in Waabiny. During the planning stages, the students had real world opportunities to contribute to our

growing community. The Year 4 and 5 students met with architects and shared their clever, creative ideas, helping shape a space that is truly built by the community for the community. From the thoughtfully named rooms and cosy reading nook to the curated outdoor play areas and Stick Museum, the students contributed meaningfully to the design of this space.

We are very grateful to our growing Little Saints community. With a passionate team of educators and a growing number of families, we have much to be proud of and much to look forward to. In Term 1 2025, we will reach another significant milestone: the opening of our Osprey Room. This special space will be home to our bespoke Three-Year-Old Kindergarten program. We look forward to welcoming more little explorers and their families as we expand our offerings and create even more Little Saints magic!
