

AIDS/HIV

HIV is the virus that causes AIDS. It is transmitted through the blood, semen, or vaginal secretions of infected persons. It is not transmitted through casual contact. Because you can't tell if someone is HIV positive by looking at them, it is important to use latex condoms when you have sex and avoid sharing IV drug needles/kits. If you do not know your HIV status, get tested. Treatment is available & works well at preventing progression to AIDS.

ANGER MANAGEMENT

Anger management is learning to recognize early signs of anger & to act without lashing out. Some signs of difficulty dealing with anger are:

- Often feel you have to hold in your anger
- Frequent arguments with your partner, children, or co-workers
- Legal troubles
- Physical violence, such as hitting your partner or children or starting fights
- Threats of violence against people or property
- Out-of-control behavior, such as breaking things or driving recklessly

New York State Sanitary Code

BATS: If you wake up to a bat or a bat is found in the room of a child or incapacitated adult, the bat must be tested for rabies. Catch it & notify the health department. Bats have tiny teeth. People have gotten rabies from bats when they did not know they were bitten. If you have bats in your home, find out how they are getting in have the problem corrected.

BEREAVEMENT

Everyone is unique and grieves in their own way. Understanding stages of grief can be helpful after experiencing a loss. Talking to a mental health counselor while you are grieving can also help.

Seven Stages of Grief by Elizabeth Kubler-Ross:

- **Shock:** unable to react to the loss.
- **Denial:** Mind refuses to accept the reality of the loss.
- **Anger**: Not everyone experiences anger, but it is normal if you do.
- **Bargaining**: Trying to "reason" your way out of the pain of the loss.
- **Depression**: This too is normal, and it is very easy to be stuck in this stage for a long time.
- **Testing**: Starting to find ways to move through the grief process.
- **Acceptance**: Accepting the reality of the loss and moving forward.

BREASTFEEDING ASSISTANCE

General Information about Breastfeeding

Breastfeeding Protects Babies

1. Early breast milk (colostrum) is "liquid gold". It is rich in nutrients and antibodies to protect your baby.

2. Breast milk changes as your baby grows. Colostrum changes to mature milk by the third to fifth day after birth. Mature breast milk has the right amount of fat, sugar, water, and protein to help your baby grow.

- 3. Breast milk is easier to digest than formula, especially for premature babies. The proteins in formula come from cow's milk and some babies have trouble digesting them. Pre-term, formula-fed babies have a higher risk of necrotizing enterocolitis, a serious disease that affects babies' intestines.
- 4. Breast milk fights disease. Cells, hormones, and antibodies in breast milk protect babies from illness. Breastfed babies have fewer ear infections, diarrheal illnesses &respiratory infections than formula-fed babies. Some research suggests breastfeeding reduces the risk of childhood diabetes, leukemia & atopic dermatitis (skin rash). Asthma, obesity & type 2 diabetes are less common in those who were breastfed.
- 5. Breastfeeding decreases the likelihood a baby will die of SIDS (sudden infant death syndrome).

Breastfeeding Benefits Mothers

- 1. It may take a little more effort than formula feeding at first, but it makes life easier in time. There are no bottles & nipples to sterilize and no measuring and mixing of formula. Breastmilk is pre-warmed and convenient for middle-of-the-night feedings.
- 2. It saves money. Formula and feeding supplies can cost over \$1,500 during a baby's first year. Because breastfed babies are sick less often, parents miss less work and health care costs are lower.
- 3. It provides opportunities for physical contact. This makes babies feel secure, warm, and comforted and requires moms to take time to relax and bond with their little ones. The skin-to-skin contact boosts mom's milk hormone levels and offers a calming effect.
- 4. It is linked to lower risks of type 2 diabetes, breast cancer, ovarian cancer, and postpartum depression.



Car Seat Inspections

Technicians assist parents in the selection, installation, and adjustment of the appropriate child passenger safety seat for their child. Seats and supplies are funded through a grant from the New York State Governor's Traffic Safety Committee and the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA).

Car Seat Replacement

Several problems may lead to the replacement of the safety seat. If the child is too heavy or too tall for the seat, if the seat has been in a crash, or if the seat is expired (more six years old), the technician will replace the problem seat with a new one that is compatible with the child and the vehicle in which it will be used.

How Long to Use Safety Seats

NY State law requires a child to be in a child safety seat until they are 8 years old. However, children should remain in some type of child safety seat until they are 4-foot, 9-inches tall or they reach the upper weight limit of the seat. Standard seat belts are designed for someone 5-foot, 6-inches tall with a weight of 125 pounds.

Always consult the owner's manual for your specific seat and vehicle and follow the manufacturer's recommendations.

CHILD PROTECTIVE SERVICES (Also see Abuse)

Child abuse may include the following:

- Child abuse is **physical** shaking, hitting, beating, burning, or biting a child.
- Child abuse is **emotional** constantly blaming or putting down a child, excessive yelling, shaming.
- Child abuse is **sexual** incest, any forced sexual activity, exposure to sexual stimulation not appropriate for the child's age.

CHILD PROTECTIVE SERVICES (Also see Abuse)

• Child abuse is **neglect** - a pattern of failure to provide for the child's physical needs, such as food, clothing, shelter, and medical care; a pattern of failure to provide for the child's emotional needs, such as affection, attention, and supervision.

SEXUALLY TRANSMITTED INFECTIONS (STI)

STI Questions: Call Ontario County Public Health 1-800-299-2995

- In NY State, the following STI's are reported to the health department: **chlamydia**, **gonorrhea**, **syphilis**, hepatitis B, and HIV.
- Every year million persons become infected with an STI.
- You can't tell by looking if a person is infected with a disease that can be passed to you during sex.
- The correct and consistent use of condoms decreases the likelihood of getting an STI.
- Condoms protect against some, but not all sexually transmitted infections.

Appendix I: Tutors for Medically Fragile Children

What is BOOST?



Boost provides supplementary tutoring for children with cancer and other chronic diseases, which may prevent normal educational development. This group of

teachers will not supplant the tutoring being provided by the school, but will act as a "boost" to a child by helping him/her better understand material being presented at the child's grade level. The goal of Boost is to do all of this with the caring and warmth of an adopted grandparent. Looking out for each child's future Boost keeps an eye on each child's future. Our tutors use their teaching expertise to fill the gap left when traditional schooling is not possible. Keeping the student on-track Boost tutors make every effort to keep the student academically on track with their peers.

How does BOOST work?

Boost does not replace the tutor from the school, but works with the teacher, parent and student to provide extra help and encouragement such as:

- Communicating with the teacher as to what assistance can be provided.
- · Going to the home once or twice a week.
- Going to the clinic to help with school work.
- Being on-call as progress is made, so that instruction is available whenever your child needs it.

Getting Started

- The Director meets one-on-one with the parents and child, so all parties can discuss the child's academic needs.
- The tutor is chosen based on the needs of the child.
- The tutor meets with the parents and child to set up a schedule and location, as well as to become acquainted with one another.
- Upon receiving permission from the parents, the tutor communicates with the school in order to coordinate services.
- The tutor meets with the child once or twice a week as long as tutoring is needed.
- Each time the tutor works with the child there must be a parent, grandparent, guardian or other responsible adult present at the location of the tutoring.

Complementing Services

Boost complements services provided by the school by helping the child:



1. Why get vaccinated?

Vaccines can prevent disease. Childhood vaccination is essential because it helps provide immunity before children are exposed to potentially life-threatening diseases.

Diphtheria, tetanus, and pertussis (DTaP)

- **Diphtheria** (**D**) can lead to difficulty breathing, heart failure, paralysis, or death.
- **Tetanus** (**T**) causes painful stiffening of the muscles. Tetanus can lead to serious health problems, including being unable to open the mouth, having trouble swallowing and breathing, or death.
- Pertussis (aP), also known as "whooping cough,"
 can cause uncontrollable, violent coughing that
 makes it hard to breathe, eat, or drink. Pertussis
 can be extremely serious, especially in babies and
 young children, causing pneumonia, convulsions,
 brain damage, or death.

Hib (*Haemophilus influenzae* type b) disease

Haemophilus influenzae type b can cause many different kinds of infections. Hib bacteria can cause mild illness, such as ear infections or bronchitis, or they can cause severe illness, such as infections of the blood. Hib infection can also cause pneumonia; severe swelling in the throat, making it hard to breathe; and infections of the blood, joints, bones, and covering of the heart. Severe Hib infection, also called "invasive Hib disease," requires treatment in a hospital and can sometimes result in death.

Hepatitis B

Hepatitis B is a liver disease that can cause mild illness lasting a few weeks, or it can lead to a serious, lifelong illness. Acute hepatitis B infection is a short-term illness that can lead to fever, fatigue, loss of appetite, nausea, vomiting, jaundice (yellow skin or eyes, dark urine, clay-colored bowel movements), and pain in the muscles, joints, and stomach. Chronic hepatitis B infection is a long-term illness that occurs when the hepatitis B virus remains in a person's body. Most people who go on to develop chronic hepatitis B do not have symptoms, but it is still very serious and can lead to liver damage (cirrhosis), liver cancer, and death.

Pneumococcal disease (PCV)

Pneumococcal disease refers to any illness caused by pneumococcal bacteria. These bacteria can cause many types of illnesses, including pneumonia, which is an infection of the lungs. Besides pneumonia, pneumococcal bacteria can also cause ear infections, sinus infections, meningitis (infection of the tissue covering the brain and spinal cord), and bacteremia (infection of the blood). Most pneumococcal infections are mild. However, some can result in long-term problems, such as brain damage or hearing loss. Meningitis, bacteremia, and pneumonia caused by pneumococcal disease can be fatal.

Your Child's First Vaccines, page 2

Polio

Polio (or poliomyelitis) is a disabling and lifethreatening disease caused by poliovirus, which can infect a person's spinal cord, leading to paralysis. Most people infected with poliovirus have no symptoms, and many recover without complications. Some people infected with poliovirus will experience sore throat, fever, tiredness, nausea, headache, or stomach pain, and most people with these symptoms will also recover without complications. A smaller group of people will develop more serious symptoms: paresthesia (feeling of pins and needles in the legs), meningitis (infection of the covering of the spinal cord and/or brain), or paralysis (can't move parts of the body) or weakness in the arms, legs, or both. Paralysis can lead to permanent disability and death.

2. DTaP, Hib, hepatitis B, pneumococcal conjugate, and polio vaccines

Infants and children usually need:

- 5 doses of diphtheria, tetanus, and acellular pertussis vaccine (DTaP)
- 3 or 4 doses of Hib vaccine
- 3 doses of hepatitis B vaccine
- 4 doses of pneumococcal conjugate vaccine (PCV)
- 4 doses of polio vaccine

Some children might need fewer or more than the usual number of doses of some vaccines to have the best protection because of their age at vaccination or other circumstances.

Older children, adolescents, and adults with certain health conditions or other risk factors or who did not get vaccinated earlier might also be recommended to receive 1 or more doses of some of these vaccines.

These vaccines are given as either stand-alone vaccines or as part of a combination vaccine (a type of vaccine that combines more than one vaccine together into one shot).

3. Talk with your health care provider

Tell your vaccination provider if the child getting the vaccine:

For all of these vaccines:

 Has had an allergic reaction after a previous dose of the vaccine, or has any severe, life-threatening allergies

For DTaP:

- Has had an allergic reaction after a previous dose of any vaccine that protects against diphtheria, tetanus, or pertussis
- Has had a coma, decreased level of consciousness, or prolonged seizures within 7 days after a previous dose of any pertussis vaccine (DTP or DTaP)
- Has seizures or another nervous system problem
- Has ever had Guillain-Barré syndrome (also called "GBS")
- Has had severe pain or swelling after a previous dose of any vaccine that protects against diphtheria or tetanus

For PCV:

 Has had an allergic reaction after a previous dose of any type of pneumococcal conjugate vaccine (PCV13, PCV15, PCV20, or an earlier pneumococcal conjugate vaccine known as PCV7), or to any vaccine containing diphtheria toxoid (for example, DTaP)

In some cases, your child's health care provider may decide to postpone vaccination until a future visit.

Children with minor illnesses, such as a cold, may be vaccinated. Children who are moderately or severely ill should usually wait until they recover before being vaccinated.

Your child's health care provider can give you more information.

4. Risks of a vaccine reaction

For all of these vaccines:

· Soreness, redness, swelling, warmth, pain, or tenderness where the shot is given can happen after vaccination.

For DTaP vaccine, Hib vaccine, hepatitis B vaccine, and PCV:

Fever can happen after vaccination.

For DTaP vaccine:

- · Fussiness, feeling tired, loss of appetite, and vomiting sometimes happen after DTaP vaccination.
- More serious reactions, such as seizures, non-stop crying for 3 hours or more, or high fever (over 105°F) after DTaP vaccination happen much less often. Rarely, vaccination is followed by swelling of the entire arm or leg, especially in older children when they receive their fourth or fifth dose.

For PCV:

- Loss of appetite, fussiness (irritability), feeling tired, headache, and chills can happen after PCV
- Young children may be at increased risk for seizures caused by fever after a pneumococcal conjugate vaccine if it is administered at the same time as inactivated influenza vaccine. Ask your health care provider for more information.

As with any medicine, there is a very remote chance of a vaccine causing a severe allergic reaction, other serious injury, or death.

5. What if there is a serious problem?

An allergic reaction could occur after the vaccinated person leaves the clinic. If you see signs of a severe allergic reaction (hives, swelling of the face and throat, difficulty breathing, a fast heartbeat, dizziness, or weakness), call 9-1-1 and get the person to the nearest hospital.

For other signs that concern you, call your health care provider.

Adverse reactions should be reported to the Vaccine Adverse Event Reporting System (VAERS). Your health care provider will usually file this report, or you can do it yourself. Visit the VAERS website at www.vaers.hhs.gov or call 1-800-822-7967. VAERS is only for reporting reactions, and VAERS staff members do not give medical advice.

6. The National Vaccine Injury **Compensation Program**

The National Vaccine Injury Compensation Program (VICP) is a federal program that was created to compensate people who may have been injured by certain vaccines. Claims regarding alleged injury or death due to vaccination have a time limit for filing, which may be as short as two years. Visit the VICP website at www.hrsa.gov/vaccinecompensation or call 1-800-338-2382 to learn about the program and about filing a claim.

Using Naloxone during an Opioid Overdose





Assess and call 911



- Attempt to wake up the individual by yelling their name or using your knuckle to rub their sternum
- · Check the individuals breathing
- · Call 911 immediately



Administer Naloxone



- Peel back packaging and remove device
- Hold device with thumb on the plunger and 2 fingers on the nozzle
- Place and hold tip of the nozzle in either nostril until you touch bottom of the nose



- Press the plunger firmly to release dose into patients nose *DO NOT TEST SPRAY*
- Repeat with second dose if no response after 2-3 minutes



Check breathing



- If person isn't breathing, do rescue breaths and/or CPR if trained and comfortable
- · Check to see if airway is clear
- Tilt person's head back, pinch nose closed, and open mouth
- Place your mouth over persons to make a seal and give 2 slow breaths
- Follow up with one breath every 5 seconds until person can breathe on their own

Stay and Assist



- · Stay with the individual and monitor them
- · Observe for withdrawal symptoms
- Place the individual on their side in the recovery position
- · Naloxone wears off in 30 to 90 minutes
- · Explain to the paramedics exactly what happened

Strong Recovery is comprised of two outpatient clinics: Chemical Dependency (SRCD), and Methadone Maintenance (SRMM). Both programs work collaboratively as one comprehensive outpatient program to bring optimal care to our patients. These programs are licensed by the New York State Office of Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Services (OASAS), and accredited by the Joint Commission.

Admission Criteria: Adults (18 years old and up) with a drug/alcohol abuse or dependence diagnosis as defined by the DSM-IV and are assessed to be capable of achieving abstinence on an outpatient level and participate in the group therapy process.

<u>Additional Criteria for Co-Occurring Disorder</u> <u>Services:</u> Patients must have an Axis I mental health diagnosis.

Additional Criteria for Methadone

Maintenance services: Verification of current
physiological dependence on Opioids for a
minimum period of 1-year.




