Purpose and Scope of the Committee

The Issaquah School District Capital Projects Oversight Committee (CPOC) is established to ensure the responsible management of bond and levy funds approved by voters. The committee's role is to review expenditures, monitor project progress, and ensure compliance with the approved bond and levy requirements. The CPOC will serve as a transparent accountability measure, providing assurance to the community that bond and levy funds for capital projects are being managed effectively and in accordance with district objectives.





Review Homework

Project Review: 2201 Holly Street ELC Playground

- Project Status: Complete
- Project Schedule: Completed on time
- Project Budget: Final cost came in lower than the estimated project budget
- Unused funds went into the Project
 Reserve, which helps supplement other
 projects within the scope of the 2022 Levy





Review Homework (continued)

Project Review: 2203 Creek Bank Repairs

- Project Status: Substantially Complete
- Project Schedule: Project is complete except for paperwork with FEMA
- Project Budget: Final cost came in higher than the estimated project budget
- Overage funds come from the Project Reserve





Review Homework (continued)

One of the committee members posed some great questions related to project 2203 Creek Bank Repairs. See questions below:

- 1. What is the explanation for the over 700-day delay in the Design Phase?
- 2. What were the change orders for?
- 3. Were the change orders the reason for the \$300,000 increase in the budget?
 - If so, was the increased cost due to delays or changes in scope?
- 4. More detail about the time delays and increase in cost would be very helpful to future PMs dealing with similar projects. It would suggest whether or not to look for greater detail.

Construction Market Update

- Seattle area construction opportunities remain limited across most market sectors resulting in an aggressive subcontractor bidding market and some K-12 projects coming in 6% to 8% below bid day estimates.
- Conversely, material prices continue to escalate, further complicated by on-again/off-again tariffs, with the more significant impacts hitting steel and aluminum.
- With labor rate increases continuing and with the material volatility, the projection for escalation is running in the 4% to 6% range.

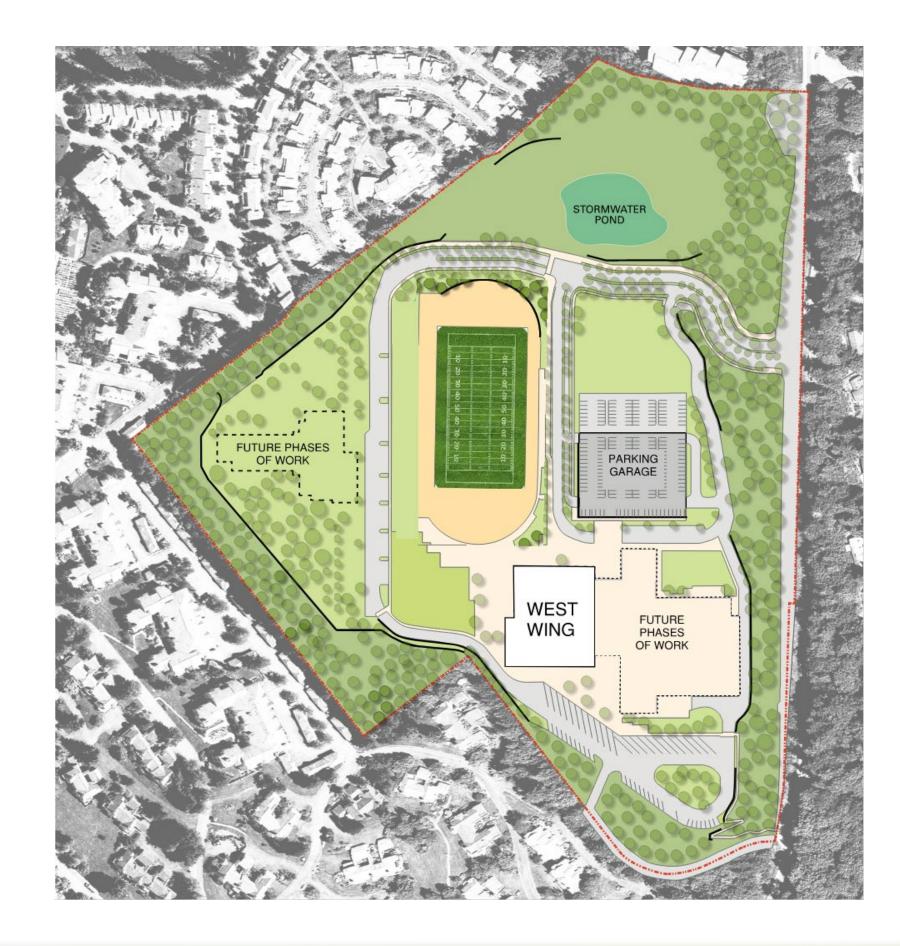
Construction Market Update (continued)

• **Bottom line:** Limited construction opportunities are creating a hungry subcontractor market across all trades, and to date it has mitigated tariff volatility on select materials. How the remainder of the tariff rollout will develop remains to be seen, but as worries continue and project funding remains frozen, an aggressive subcontractor market will continue.



New High School Update

- The project is being constructed using available funds \$146,000,000
- The process of making revisions to the existing project continues
- Initial meetings with the City of Issaquah have begun
- Community engagement and programming discussions Fall 2025
- Target construction start date remains March 1, 2026
- Expected opening date of the school remains August 2027
