Adult Pharmacy Technician Program

Students will prepare to work under the supervision and direction of a pharmacy supervisor, or staff pharmacist. Graduates will demonstrate pharmaceutical knowledge, clinical skills and values necessary to practice as a competent pharmacy technical in both community/retail and hospital pharmacy settings. Students successfully completing this Pharmacy Technician program will be able to apply for a Pharmacy Technician license and take the Pharmacy Technician exam.

Career Opportunities:

Pharmacy Technician opportunities are available in community/retail pharmacies, hospitals, home health care, mail order, nursing homes, long term care, health insurance companies, veterinary clinics, and public and government medical facilities.

This Pharmacy Technician Certification Board Recognized Education/Training Program qualifies students to take the Pharmacy Technician Certification Exam ® (PTCE®).



Prerequisite: Must have a high school diploma or GED and PTE assessment with a score in reading and math at the 8.0 grade level.

Program Cost: \$1825 per quarter (total cost of course is \$3,650) Additional costs include: \$300 for books, lab coat, and testing fee.

Duration of the program: 7 month program including coursework and 120 hours of externship.

Requirement: Must maintain a "C" or better grade in the first 2 quarters to be eligible for externship. More information about the program requirements, common Q&As, and the course syllabus can be found at mvrop.org
