

GSD CLASS OF 2025 GRADUATION

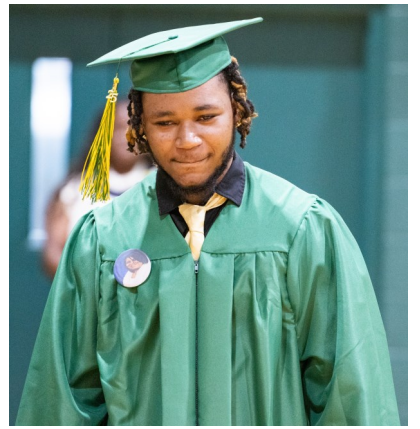

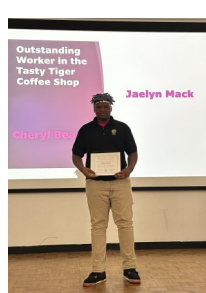


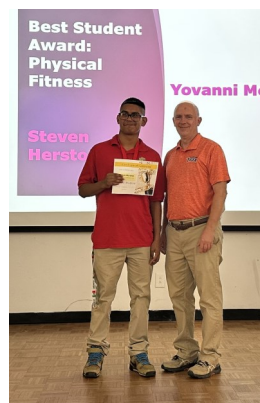
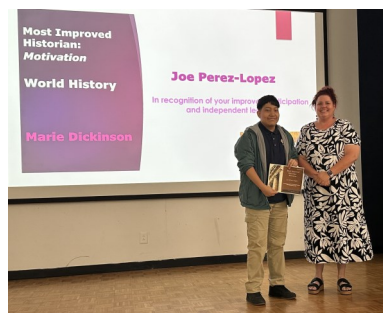
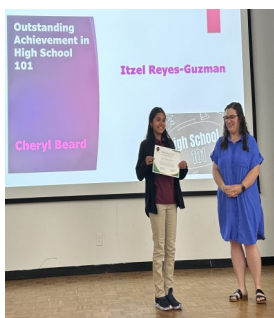
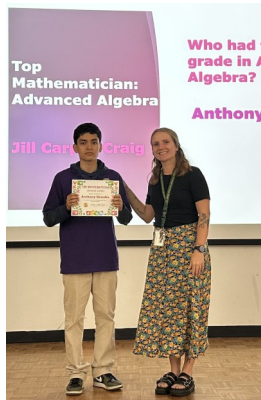
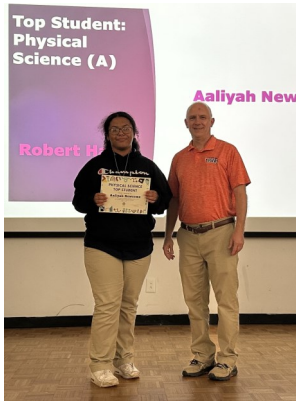
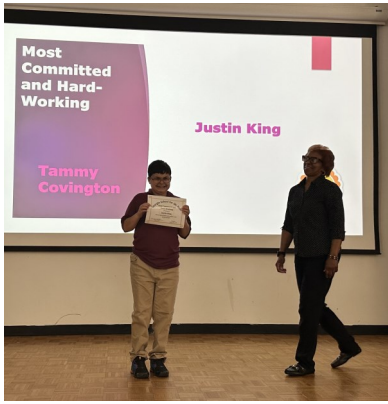




Awards

Elementary Awards

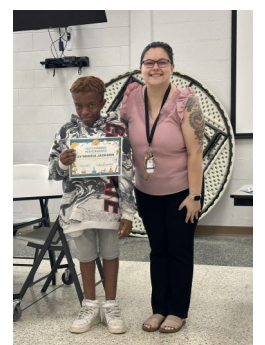


The 5th grade students completed their Fire Prevention at Level Five Fire Safety course, which is provided by the Rome-Floyd County Fire Department.

Dana Tarter's class celebrated the last day of school with fun pictures, dancing, and a celebration of all they have learned this year. Great job, everyone!!

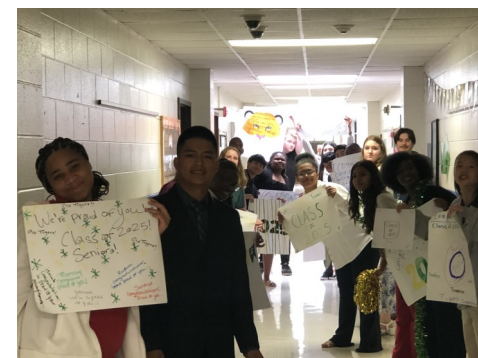
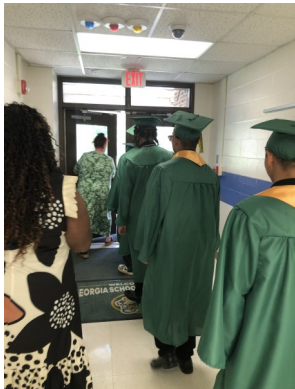

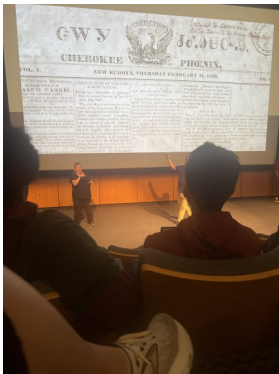
Teacher of the Year

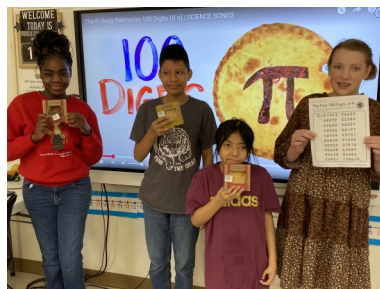
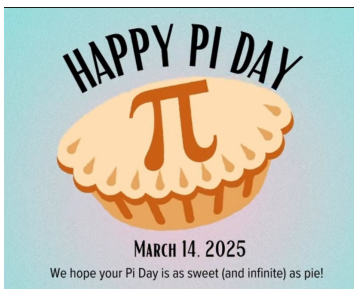
De'VIA Art Contest

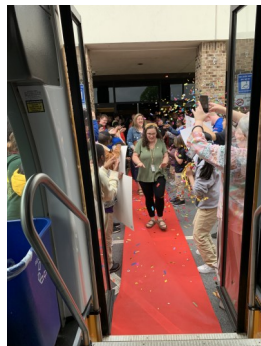
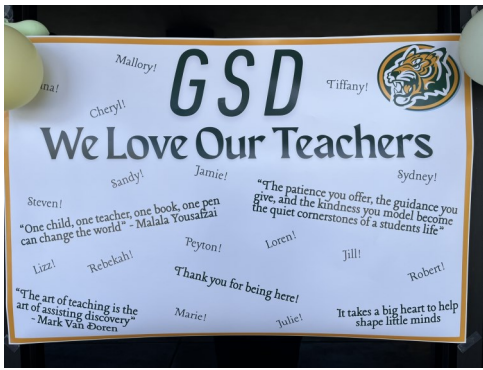

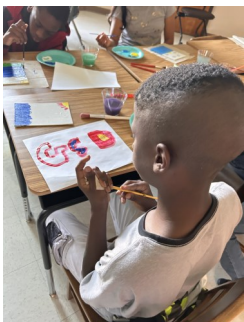




Teacher Appreciation Week

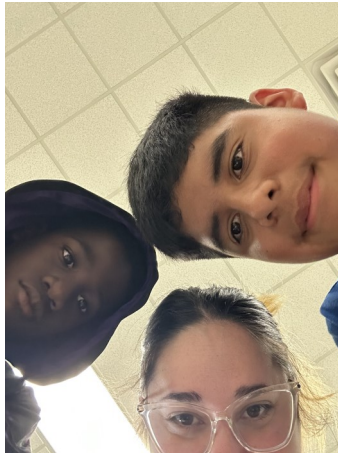
