REPORT OF COMMITTEES OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION

- **Ms. Johnson, Education – Discussion on the STEM School and students moving into the High School.** Thirty students tested for the High School Magnet program. Sixteen of them were from Roosevelt and the rest were a combination of students from other schools in the district. These students will attend AP classes at the High School until the Magnet School construction is completed. Discussion about student credit requirement in order to participate in the Athletics program. NJSBA is holding a virtual Spring Conference on May 30th. Joe Theismann will be a guest speaker at the NJSBA Workshop conference in October. NJSBA director goals for 24-25 are to revamp the New Board Member Orientation Governance I online curriculum, examine NJSBA Urban Boards Committee to ensure it is operating to best service members and survey effectiveness and evaluate quarterly NJSBA Capitol Watch newsletters. There was a Delegate assembly on May 10th.
- **Mrs. Matos, Education – We received an award for Engineering.**
- **Mr. Carey, Buildings and Operations – The High School front parking lot is operational. The STEM wing is progressing.**
- **Mr. McDevitt, NJSBA Representative – Attended the Delegate Assembly. A Resolution was submitted to allow school districts to give out varsity letters for E-sports, which passed. REPORT OF BOARD SOLICITOR

- **Mr. Li, Board Solicitor - The Sunscreen at School Act has passed, which requires school districts to adopt a policy concerning students use of sunscreen and sun protective clothing while outdoors at school and school sponsored events. The policy does not require school district staff to assist in the application of the sunscreen, nor is the school district required to provide the sunscreen. The policy must be adopted for the 2025-2026 school year. There are two bills pending in legislature, one is requiring the Department of Education to develop a cell phone and social media guidelines model policy and districts will be required to adopt a policy concerning student use of cell phones and social media platforms during regular school hours, on a school bus or during school sanctioned events when the student is under the direct supervision of a teaching staff member or employee of the Board of Education. Another pending bill requires certain information to be provided to parents in writing in advance of a student who is eligible for special education before their annual IEP meeting. That written information will be required to be provided to parents a minimum of two business days before the meeting and would include the student's current levels of academic and functional performance, a list of names of any required IEP team members requesting to be excused from participating in the IEP team meeting and an invitation to the parents or guardians to provide input and feedback as to programs and services proposed in the student's IEP. The bill will also require the Department of Education to establish the IEP improvement working group which would convene and provide best practices and suggestions to districts on development and implements of IEP's. Will keep the Board updated as those bills make their way through the legislature.**
