Excellent

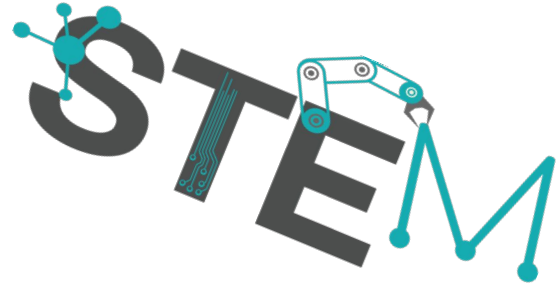
I strive to be **OUTSTANDING** in everything I do so I can make myself proud and set myself up for a bright future.

Restrooms

- Use facility quickly and return to class

- Give privacy to others
- Use the facilities during appropriate times (during class only if it is an emergency)



Hallways

- One way is the right way, walk on the right side of the hallway
- Avoid “parking” in the hallway
- Keep hands and feet to self
- Have a pass ready and visible
- Travel directly to your destination
- Keep hallways and lockers clean
- Use walking feet and quiet voices everywhere we go
- Be aware of others moving through the halls
- Control your words and voices



Arrival & Dismissal

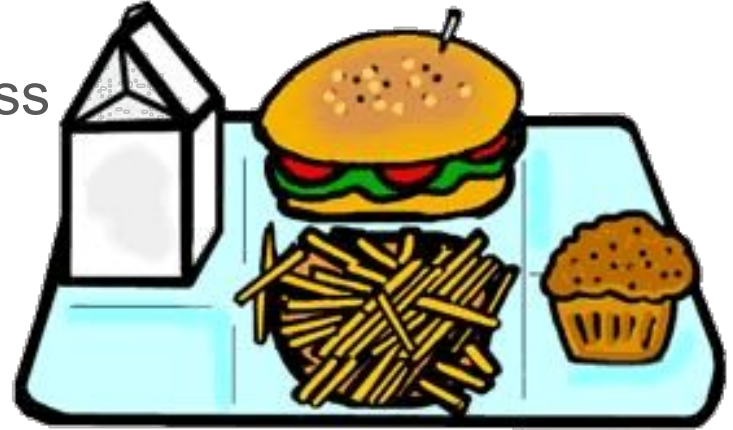
- Stay in designated area until dismissed
- Use designated doors
- Put mask on when entering building
- Grab breakfast and report to 1st block in a timely manner
- Enter and exit the building calmly and in an organized manner
- Be aware of social distancing



Common Areas

(cafeteria, gym, lit lounge, recess)

- Alert an adult of any unsafe or dangerous situations
- Use problem solving strategies when conflicts arise
- Treat visitors as welcomed guests
- Keep common areas trash free
- Be an ally and treat others with kindness
- Use positive and appropriate language

Technology

- Use equipment properly

- Avoid eating or drinking while using the chromebook
- Use the chromebook for school work only
- Be prepared to learn new technological programs and activities

- Keep your cameras on OR verbally participate throughout the class period.

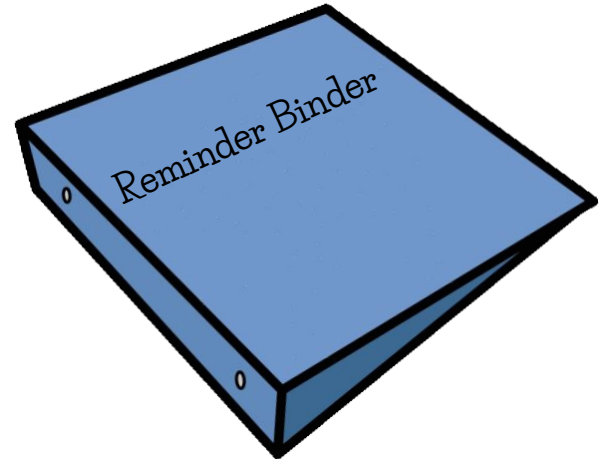
You will earn a coin at the end of each week in each class!



Reminder Binder

What is the Reminder Binder?
