Mrs. Colantuoni took her Math Academy to attend the American Automobile Association (AAA) Teen Safety Summit for Gen Z Drivers. They had the opportunity to listen to Marianna Angelillo, who spoke to the students about her life and the death of her 17 year-old son, including the decisions he and those around him made that day. There were several interactive portions of the day as well. The students watched Utica Firefighters use the Jaws of Life to get into a car. They were also able to use simulation goggles to understand impaired driving. Lastly, the students listened to experts analyze the math and physics behind driving and how even a quick look away from the road can lead to detrimental consequences. Body Systems Presentations













This month, Mrs. Stevens and Mrs. Kovacs combined their Living Environment classes for a unit involving project-based learning and peer teaching. Groups of students researched different body systems and created a model of that system, then they taught the rest of the students about their topic. The students spoke about their models, important anatomical aspects of the system and potential diseases and disorders involved with that system.

While observing other groups' presentations, students listened intently and took notes about the body systems that they did not research themselves. Students reported that they enjoyed making the models and learned a lot from their peers.















Mrs. Kovacs brought her Living Environment students to explore the Conservation Program's greenhouse. Mr. Lacelle provided an insightful tour and gave a brief explanation of the aquaponics growing system in the greenhouse, which is maintained by the senior CTE students. This visit kicks off the new Living Environment unit where Mrs. Kovacs introduces a phenomenon to guide the students' learning and ground it in a real-world concept.

Throughout this unit, students will discover the living processes being use to sustain life. The aquaponics system is nearly self-sustaining and demonstrates the principles that the Living Environment students will study in this unit. Mr. Lacelle shared with the students how the water flows through the system, what the fish need and the types of plants that grow and thrive within the system. This was an excellent hands-on experience for our students. Thank you Mr. Lacelle and CTE for allowing us to join!




