Position requirements: Candidates will be expected to have an undergraduate and/or advanced degree in education or a subject-specific field and have experience working with middle school students. Candidates should also have a commitment to innovative teaching methods, enthusiasm for teaching within a diverse community of learners, effective classroom management, strong communication skills, and a willingness to collaborate with others.

Responsibilities will include but not limited to:

- Full-time teaching in a nurturing and educational setting that prepares young learners for academic, social, and emotional success
- Working collaboratively with unit and departmental teams to ensure high quality lessons and programming for a diverse group of learners from a variety of backgrounds
- Partnering with families with clear and consistent communication regarding student progress
- Professional interactions with colleagues, students and parents
- Other duties as assigned by the Upper School Head
