PART ONE- STUDENT ACTIVITIES PARTICIPATION

Participation in student activities is a privilege, not a right. In order for a student to participate in activities, they must meet the eligibility requirements set by the Minnesota State High School League (MSHSL) and Delano Public Schools.

ACCELERATION PROCEDURE

The acceleration procedure applies to 7th and 8th grade students with exceptional skills beyond the middle school level. The individual skills, social maturity, academic history, and discipline history of the student will be taken into consideration for acceleration. To accelerate an athlete should be placed on the varsity roster and receive regular playing time, or be used to fill needed roster positions. These decisions should be discussed with the Activities Office and Community Education when applicable.

ATTENDANCE

In order to participate in practice, competitions or performances students must be in school all day. Also reference [School Board Policy](#) 503-7.

Exceptions include: pre-approved appointments, funerals, family emergencies, school-sponsored events, and religious requirements. Additional extenuating circumstances must be cleared by the High School Principal or Activities Director. Attendance reports will be provided to coaches daily.

BEHAVIOR

Students who have been suspended, in-school or out of school, will not be allowed to participate in athletic practices, rehearsals, or competitions during the period of suspension. A student that is suspended will not be allowed to participate as a fan at any events during the period of suspension.

CAPTAINS PRACTICE

Captain's practice is primarily for the purpose of physical conditioning, and is organized and conducted by the students. Students may participate in captain's practice provided that salaried and non-salaried school personnel are not involved in any capacity.

Student leaders, or captains, can schedule practice with the TAC Facility Coordinator up to two weeks prior to the beginning of their season. Reservations will be free of

charge. All participants will be required to complete a participation waiver and have an adult supervisor present.

COMMUNICATION

We encourage players to have open, honest communication with the coaching staff, and to expect the same in return. For general concerns, please follow the protocol below. For situations regarding the health and safety of a student-athlete, please contact the coach and/or Activities Director.

Step 1: Student meets with the coaching staff and discusses concerns

Step 2: If there is not a satisfactory resolution to the problem after step one, then a meeting can be scheduled to include the player, the parent(s), and the coaching staff.

Step 3: A meeting including the Activities Coordinator will be scheduled.

ELIGIBILITY

As an education-based activities program, we believe academics is the most important part of their school career. Students participating in athletics and activities will be required to maintain satisfactory academic performance and be making progress towards graduation in order to participate.

Grade checks, for the purpose of eligibility, will happen on predetermined dates throughout the season. Participants are expected to maintain passing grades, D- or higher. Failing grades on these reports will result in athletes being ineligible for competition until they are passing. In the event a student is deemed ineligible, participants are still required to attend practices. The High School Principal or Activities Director can impose additional grade checks to promote academic progress for students identified as ineligible during the season.

LETTERING

Lettering criteria for varsity participants will be outlined in sport specific handbooks. All letterwinners should be in good standing, and meet all specified requirements.

MINIMUM SKILL REQUIREMENTS

Participation in athletic programs requires students to demonstrate a basic level of physical fitness and coordination appropriate to the sport. Students must exhibit a

willingness to learn, ability to follow multi-step directions, and meet all program-specific safety requirements.

MSHSL POLICY

For detailed information regarding MSHSL policy, please refer to the MSHSL [Eligibility Brochure](#). The Delano School District endorses the Minnesota State High School League's position on the use/abuse of mood-altering chemicals, tobacco, and/or alcohol as well as the Code of Conduct. Penalties will be cumulative beginning with student's participation in junior high and through high school activities. During the school year, a student shall not engage in sexual, racial or religious harassment or sexual, racial, religious violence or hazing. Violations will result in game suspensions and additional treatment requirements. All MSHSL bylaws will be applied to teams involving 7-12th grade participants.

REGISTRATION

Prior to each activity season, participants must register online in order to participate in practice, games, or competitions. Completed registration includes fees, parent consent forms, and a copy of a valid sports physical. Registrations will be accepted through the first week of the season.

ACTIVITIES FEES

- Athletic Fees \$240, \$539 for Hockey
- Activities Fees \$90 per activity

Per Board Policy, activity fees will account for 18-20% of all activities program expenses and are subject to change on a yearly basis in accordance with program expenses and revenue.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

All students who are interested in participating in activities should not be discouraged due to cost. Educational Benefits, through the Minnesota Department of Education include discounted activity fees, and sports fees among other benefits. Please contact the Activities Office for assistance.

REFUNDS

In the event a student voluntarily terminates from a program, no refund will be issued after the first week. All canceled registrations/refunds will be subject to a processing fee.

SPORTS PHYSICALS

Sports physicals are required for all athletes starting in 7th grade. Sports Physicals are valid for 3 years and should be turned into the Activities Office. Also reference the [MSHSL Eligibility Brochure](#).

SAFETY

By its nature, participation in athletics includes risk or injury and the transmission of infectious diseases such as HIV and Hepatitis B. Although serious injuries are not common and the risk of HIV transmission is almost nonexistent in supervised school athletic programs, it is impossible to eliminate all risk. Participants have the responsibility to help reduce that risk. Participants must obey all safety rules, report all physical and hygiene problems to their coaches, follow a proper conditioning program, and inspect their own equipment daily.

ATHLETIC TRAINER

All Delano athletes will have access to a Ridgeview Medical provided Athletic Trainer. In the event of an injury, parent or doctor's permission to return to play, or follow up care may be required. Trainer availability and attended events are subject to change, and may vary.

IMPACT TESTING

Student-athletes are required to complete Impact testing. Testing will be coordinated with our Ridgeview Medical provided Athletic Trainer. The Impact test gathers data regarding current brain function that can be used to help determine Return to Play protocols following a concussion or other traumatic brain injury.

INSURANCE

All Delano Public School students have access to optional insurance coverage. Reference the [District Website](#) for details.

SCHEDULES

Families and participants can access the online [Activities Calendar](#) for the most up-to-date information regarding game schedules, times, locations, directions, ticketing details, and streaming links. Families are encouraged to check the calendar frequently, as changes to schedules, such as weather-related adjustments, will be updated promptly.

SCHOOL POLICY

Participants will follow all Delano Public School policies outlined in School Board policy, the DHS Handbook, and Activities expectations required of students along with consequences established by the district.

SPECTATORS

MSHSL Behavior Expectations: To create safe, welcoming and inclusive environments in fine arts and sports in our school and competitions, I will:

- Lead by positive example and demonstrate respect and support for others.
- Follow all MSHSL, school and venue expectations.
- Refrain from using profanity or ethnic, racial, religious, ability or gender-based comments, posts or messages directed at participants, directors, coaches, officials, spectators, or team representatives.
- Act as a responsible and respectful digital citizen who positively uses social media platforms.
- Speak or act in support of others when they are harmed by words or actions.
- Honor each contest and all involved, including participants, directors, coaches, officials, spectators, and team representatives.
- Hold high standards for myself, engage positively and demonstrate sportsmanship.

Also reference [Board Policy 510](#). The school board expects all spectators at school sponsored activities, including parents, employees, and other members of the public, to behave in an appropriate manner at those activities. Students and employees may be subject to discipline and parents and other spectators may be subject to sanctions for

engaging in misbehavior or inappropriate, illegal or unsportsmanlike behavior at these activities or events

TICKETING

Tickets for Delano High School events can be purchased online, some events also offer cash options. Please note that punch passes or DHS annual passes can not be used for admission at tournaments, theater performances, or section events.

TRANSPORTATION

A student must ride to and from a scheduled contest on district provided transportation. Should alternative transportation arrangements be required, arrangements will be made in advance and approved by administration.

WEIGHT ROOM

The weight room will be open to all DHS student-athletes from 3-4:15pm daily to support strength training and conditioning. Student-athletes are expected to follow posted guidelines, respect the facility, and use the time productively to enhance their athletic performance. Any misuse of equipment or failure to follow expectations may result in loss of access privileges.
