LEARNING SNAPSHOTS

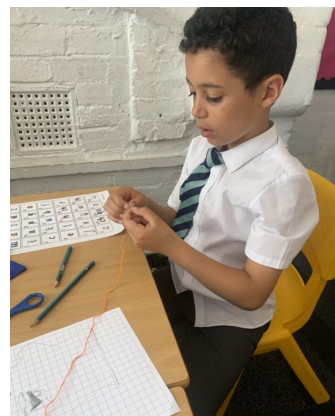
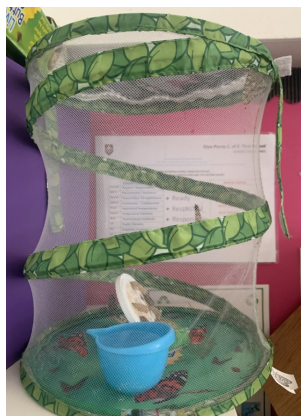
Year 1 have had a busy week! They have loved 'Chop, Slice and Mash'. They designed a sandwich and enjoyed making it. They have also been learning about programming and algorithms. They have enjoyed having a go programming using Scratch Junior.

Year 2 have absolutely loved their new design project 'Cut, Stitch and Join' where they have looked at a range of items and materials, designed a bag tag and have practised a range of sewing techniques. We definitely have some future designers and dressmakers in our class!

Year 3 launched into science learning about plants this week, they revisited parts of a plant and learnt about their functions. They then set up an experiment to explore how plants transport water through their vessels. We also explored parts of leaves and went on a nature walk to sketch different types noting their shape, colour and size. 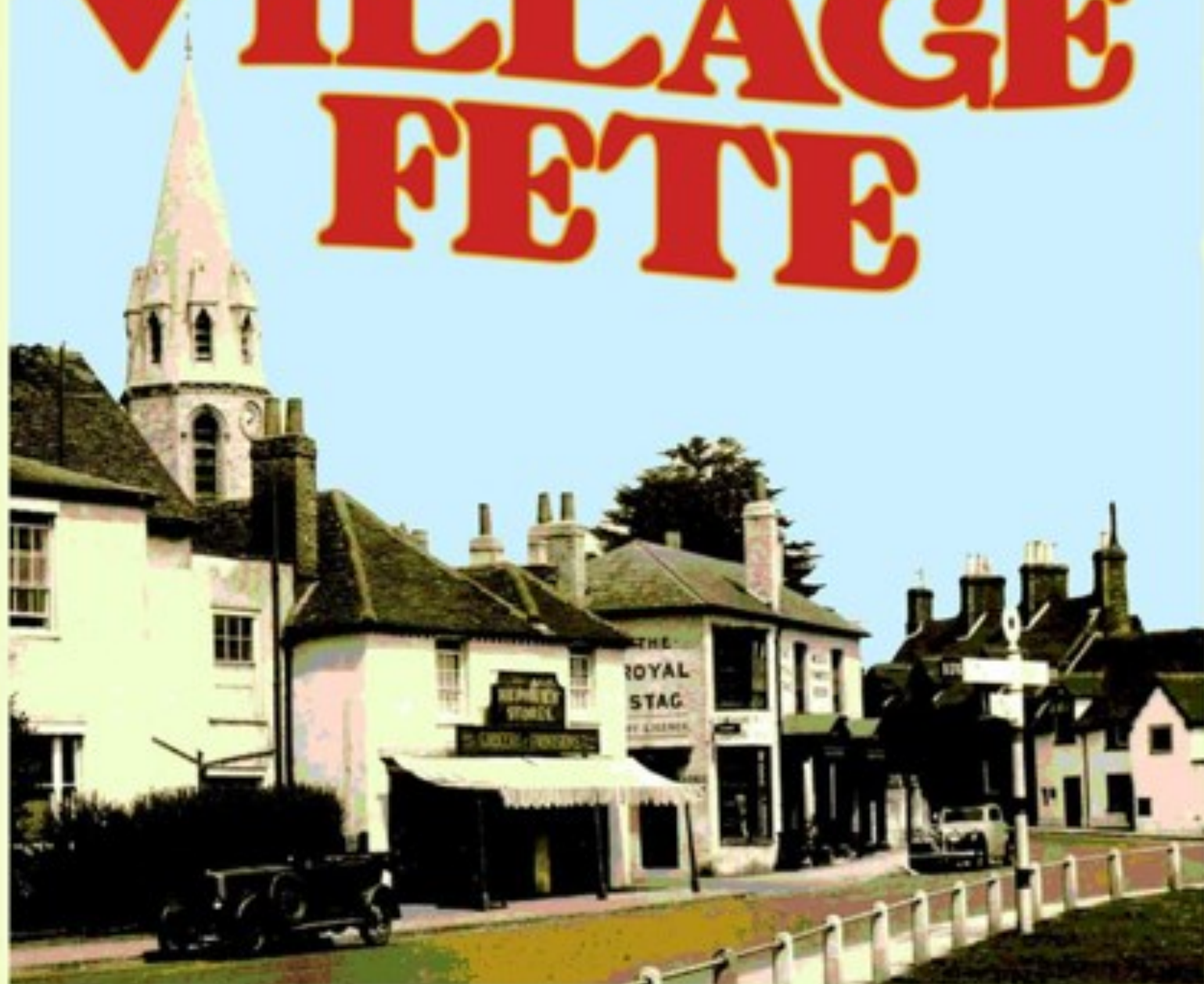
