

# From Challenge to Champion



Logan Hearld, a 2025 Elkhart High School graduate, is living proof of the Elkhart Promise in action: every student known by name, challenged, and supported. For much of his educational journey, Logan had difficulty finding direction until he discovered the CNC Machining program at the Elkhart Area Career Center (EACC), where academics met real-world skills and opened the door to his future.

At the EACC, Logan didn't just find a program; he found purpose and confidence. The hands-on learning environment allowed him to thrive, and his talent quickly rose to the top. This spring, Logan was named Indiana's top student CNC machinist after earning first place at the state SkillsUSA competition. He will represent Indiana at the national championships in Atlanta this June.

Before graduating, Logan was already working part-time at MorRyde, one of EACC's valued business partners committed to providing real-world opportunities for students. Now, he is stepping into a full-time role at \$28 an hour, launching a career with a projected \$58,000 salary and room to grow.

Logan's journey is a clear example of how strong industry partnerships and career-focused academics prepare students not just for graduation, but for life.


