



Prop 28: Arts and Music in Schools Funding Report

Fiscal Year 2024-2025

Allocation: \$ 354,364

1. Narrative description of the Prop 28 arts education program funded:

Gateway USD has 3.10 FTE teaching positions dedicated to delivering comprehensive art/music education to students from Transitional Kindergarten (TK) through twelfth grade. At Shasta Lake School and Grand Oaks Elementary, TK-5th grade students participate in art classes once a week, each session lasting approximately 30-40 minutes.

For the 6th - 8th at Shasta Lake School, art is integrated into their daily schedule as an elective. Similarly, students in grades 7-12 at Toyon Learning Center engage in art as a chosen elective every day. At Central Valley HS, students participated in music education.

Each teacher crafts lessons designed to actively engage students and foster their creativity. Many of the art lessons are interconnected with other classroom subjects to enhance overall student learning.

During the 2024-2025 school year, the support from Prop 28: Arts and Music in Schools enabled the district to provide art/music education to a total of 747 students. The program has successfully elevated students' artistic skills and creativity, significantly contributing to their comprehensive education experience.

Unfortunately, the Art position at Buckeye School was unable to be filled during the 2024-2025 school year.
