**COLLEGE & CAREER**

The College and Career Center is hosting a workshop after school on October 12<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> to assist seniors with their personal statements.

All this week, all seniors will be visiting the computer lab to participate in mandatory CSU/EOP application workshops. Through their social science teacher, Students are brought to the computer lab to start their college applications, and receive assistance from our College and Career Center staff as well as Ms. Astorga, our 12<sup>th</sup> grade counselor.

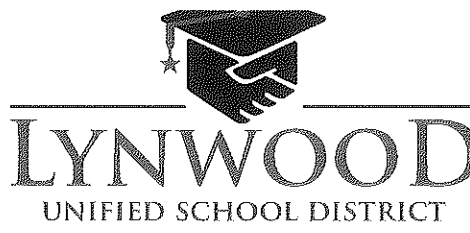
