SPORTS

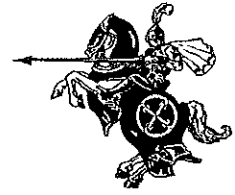

SBAC - Teachers are beginning to prepare for the SBAC test in the spring. they are giving students SBAC questions as warm ups for students at the beginning of classes.

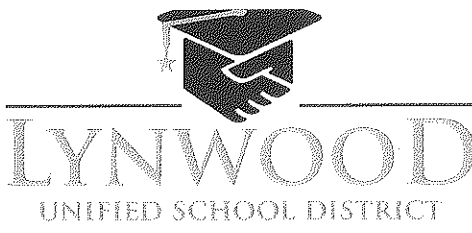
Black College Expo - On Saturday, February 6th we had about 20 sophomores and juniors attend the Black College Expo. They received tons of valuable information about possible college choices.

Board President Ms. Renteria, Members of the Board of Education, Superintendent Paul Gothold, Lynwood Unified School District officials, fellow students, friends, and family members. Good evening.

My name is Denise Renee Evans, and I am the Associated Student Body President at Lynwood Community Adult School.

To begin this month, Adult students and staff have been busily preparing projects that celebrate African American Heritage. The theme of this year's event is "heroes and hallowed sites." Each class is researching the theme and will present their class project at assemblies both at the Atlantic and Imperial Sites which will take place on Wednesday, February, 24, 2016. The Atlantic assembly will begin at 10am and conclude at 11am. The Imperial assembly will begin at 6pm and conclude at 700pm. Adult students and staff are excitedly preparing their projects and are eager to participate in this year's event.

The HiSET examination began on Monday, February 08, 2016, and will conclude on Wednesday, February 10, 2016. Nineteen people have registered to take the test. The cost of the test is \$120 for adult students and \$130 for non-students. Retest fees are \$20 per test. The next scheduled HiSET examination will be held on March 7, 8, and 9 (Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday) at 3:00pm.

Continuing the work established by AB 86, the Tri City Consortium composed of Lynwood Community Adult School (Lynwood Unified School District), Paramount Adult School (Paramount Unified School District), Compton Adult School (Compton Unified School District), and El Camino College Compton Center, continues to formalize plans to enhance and expand educational services to adults in this region. More recently, AB 104 has provided guidelines and has established the Adult Education Block Grant and the requirement to submit a three year plan summary.

It is noteworthy to mention that nineteen Adult School students were recognized by the Los Angeles Homeless Services Authority for participating in the 2016 Greater Los Angeles Homeless Count in the City of Lynwood. The homeless census and demographic data gathered serve to shine a light on the critical issue of homelessness, and the data is also used to support programs and funding for the homeless.

The Adult School is happy to announce that the final software installation for the GED lab is now complete, and the GED lab is now open. The administration and staff would like to thank the Board of Education, the Lynwood Unified School District Administration, and District Technology for helping to make this a reality.
