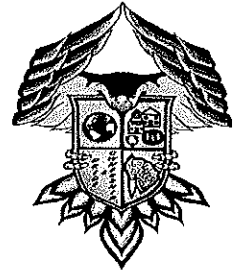

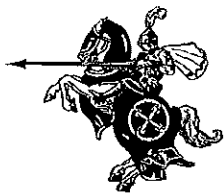

- **Volleyball** - Girls Volleyball will have their last game of the season on Tuesday, November 3rd.

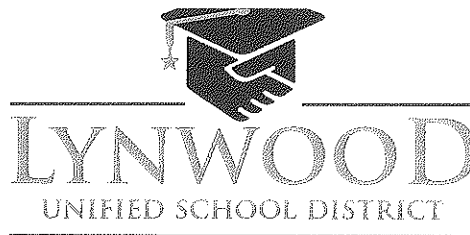
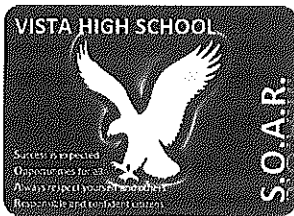
