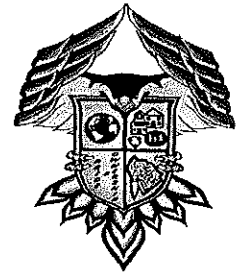

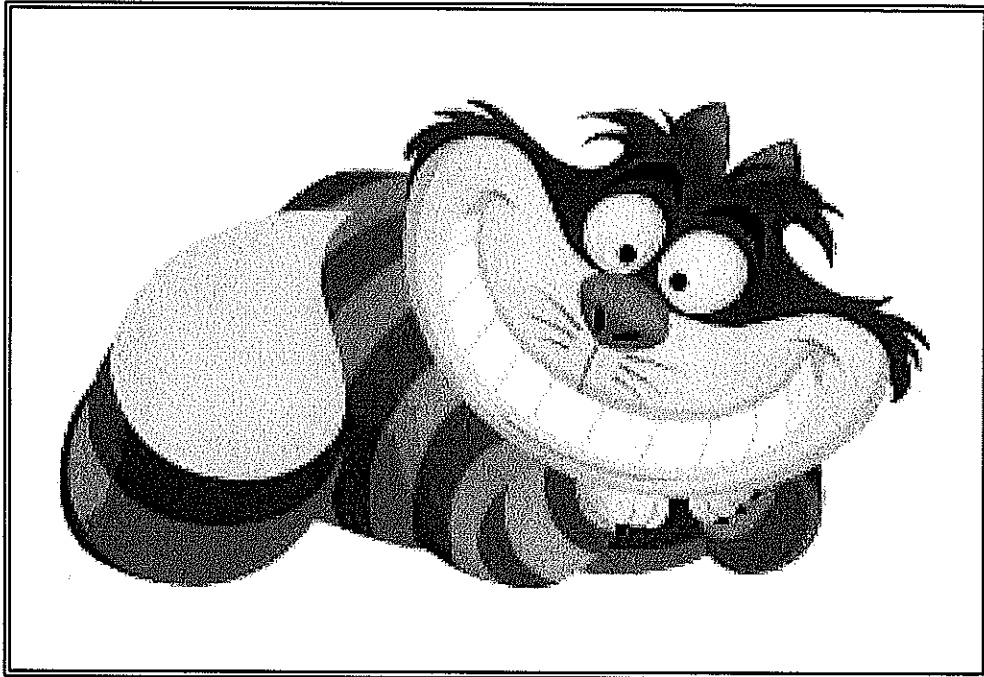
Sports

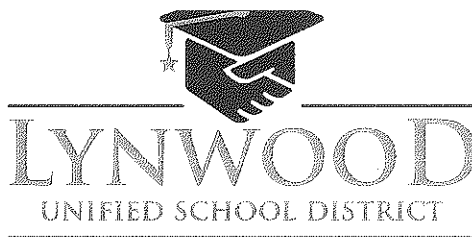
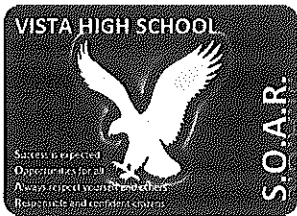

My name is Elizabeth Zaragoza, and I am the Associated Student Body President at Lynwood Community Adult School.

On Thursday and Friday, September 24th and 25th, representatives from the Tri City Consortium (Lynwood, Paramount, and Compton) attended the AB86 Adult Education Regional Planning Summit that was held in Sacramento, California. The Summit brought together representatives from all 70 adult education regions as well as the State AB86 Work Group and Cabinet to engage in discussions on how to better serve the educational needs of adults in California. Great strides are being made by consortia throughout the State in drafting plans for adult education in their respective regions.

The Adult School continues to recognize student achievement by hosting a Student of the Month luncheon on September 29th at the Atlantic Site. Students were given Certificates of Achievement, and photos were taken of them and will be framed in a special section of the Atlantic Site hallway.
