# **Standard Procedure for Caring for Vascular Access Device**

#### Vascular Access Device (VAD) is Pulled Out:

- 1. Put on gloves.
- 2. Cover VAD exit site with sterile gauze (if available) or clean dressing and apply pressure to site.
- 3. Immediately notify the parent/guardian and the child is to go home. EMS may be called at parent request.

## Vascular Access Device (VAD) Catheter Tubing is Broken:

- 1. Immediately clamp tubing and have child lie on left side.
- 2. Transport child to health office DO NOT ALLOW CHILD TO WALK.
- 3. Immediately notify the parent/guardian and the child is to be picked up and transferred to an appropriate emergency care site. EMS may be called at parent request.

#### **Child Complains of Chest Pain or Difficulty Breathing:**

- 1. Immediately clamp tubing and have the child lie on left side.
- 2. Transport child to health office DO NOT ALLOW CHILD TO WALK.
- 3. Immediately notify the parent/guardian and the child is to be picked up and transferred to an appropriate emergency care site. EMS may be called at parent request.

## Blood in Tubing or Bleeding from End of Catheter:

- 1. Wash hands and put on gloves.
- 2. Clamp tubing and transport child to health office.
- 3. Immediately notify the parent/guardian and ask them to come to school to evaluate the VAD. EMS may be called at parent request.

#### Fever, Redness at Vascular Access Device Site:

1. Sign of infection – notify parents to pick up child.

# **Vascular Access Device Supplies**

- 1. Emergency Tubing Clamps
- 2. Extra Opsite or silk tape to secure tubing in place
- 3. Skin Prep pads to apply before adding extra tape to the skin
- 4. Sterile gauze
- 5. Non-sterile gauze
