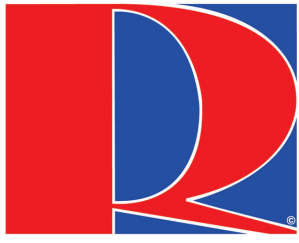

# High School Arts & Activities



## Raytown High School

- 22 athletes made all-conference for Track and Field
- The Raytown esports team won districts and secured their spot as one of seven teams to compete at state
- The theatre department received four nominations for Blue Star Awards and 15 nominations for Kansas City Cappies Awards
- Boys Golf had 17 golfers, nine returning and eight new. JV won matches against Raytown South, Belton, Grandview, and Oak Park
- Raytown Speech and Debate students had a great year. They landed on semifinals and finals posters 64 times, and took home 42 trophies and medals
- Orchestra received an Exemplary Rating at State for a Large Ensemble
- The Scholar Bowl team won twice as many matches this year vs last year and Jacob Weaver made the all-district team
- Boys Wrestling had two state qualifiers for the first time in ten years. Girls Wrestling had two state qualifiers - a school record
- 11 students earn their Seal of Biliteracy certifying them as bilingual in Spanish in the state of Missouri
- Boys Basketball - JV was undefeated in conference play and Varsity boasted a 22-3 record and ranked #4 in Class 5 conf.

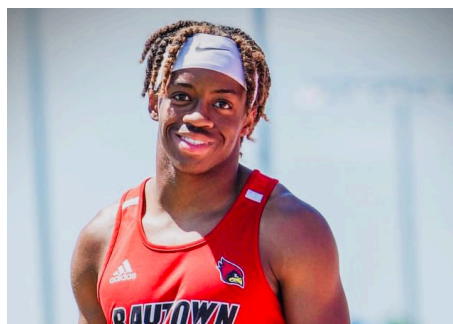

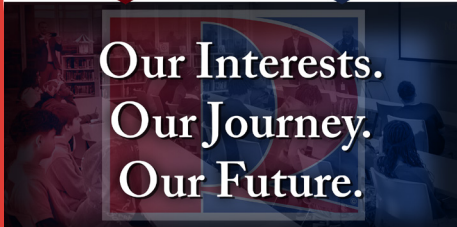

## Freshman Academies



We are excited to announce that beginning in the 2025-2026 school year, Raytown Quality Schools will introduce a Freshman Academy at both Raytown and Raytown South High Schools. This initiative is a key step in our commitment to transforming the high school experience to better prepare students for success in college, careers, and life.



The Freshman Academy will serve as the foundation of this transformation. In 9th grade, students will enter a supportive and structured environment designed to ease the transition into high school while allowing time to explore the wide range of course offerings that will be offered within the Academies of Raytown in the coming school years. Through this exploration, students will discover their individual interests and strengths and then select a "home" academy — a smaller learning

community — for their 10th through 12th grade years. An example of an academy could be "Health and Human Services." A pathway within that academy could be "first responders" or "law and justice."
