How a Child Can Help Themselves in Math

Tests: When a test has been graded and returned via Gmail, students should look at the questions they got incorrect, look at the feedback (expected solution with justification), go back and find their error(s), correct them on paper, then explain what was done different.

These math concepts and/or facts are huge in upper grade and should be mastered. The following are CRITICAL:
Division and multiplication facts from 0-14
Place values from millions to thousandths
Adding and subtracting whole numbers and decimals with regrouping

Multiplying whole numbers and decimals Dividing whole numbers and decimals

Every concept above is not taught in sixth grade and above. Students are expected to have them mastered before entering those grades for future success.

Where can resources be found for your child? This is a two part answer. 1). Students must take the work seriously and put time into learning the content not just click and go. Parent need to monitor, check the work, and be sure the time is being used with best intentions. 2). Here are some resources our district offers: Khan Academy using Clever Login
