Use Bullets to Summarize Student Feedback

- Transportation needs
- Getting extra help with behavior
- Need to see more of their culture reflected at school
- 61% felt they could talk to an adult at their school. 72% said the school is welcoming
- Need help getting clothing and/shoes
- More neighborhood activities
- Help with feeling sad, worried, scared both for student and family



Use Bullets to Summarize Staff Feedback

- Students need help with mental health
- As a school we can improve how we engage families, it's a we thing, Therefore, we as a collective need to make changes
- We need more extracurriculars
- Need more small group interventions (maybe more PDs to support how we run these)

Use Bullets to Summarize Family Feedback

- Almost 60% “sometimes” go to events hosted at the school-while 29% “always” go
- Volunteers-always 10%-sometimes/60% rarely
- Student mental health
- ParentVue concerns
- Staff help your family feel included; 63% always
- School welcomes everyone-77% always

Priorities and Opportunities	
Rigorous, Community-Connected Classroom Instruction and Expanded, Enriched Learning Opportunities 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Partner with local organizations to expand academic enrichment opportunities during and beyond the school day, especially for students with low attendance and academic achievement. • Integrate culturally relevant instruction, particularly highlighting the diverse backgrounds of Jenifer’s students (e.g., Hispanic Heritage Month partnerships).
Collaborative Leadership, Shared Power, and Voice 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Strengthen student and family voice in decision-making by utilizing needs assessment and survey data regularly to inform programming. • Involve student leadership and family representatives on the Community Schools Steering Committee.
Integrated Systems of Support 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Address the top identified needs: transportation support (59.9%), clothing/shoes (57.9%), and mental health services (52.8%). • Leverage community partnerships and county resources to build a coordinated referral system for basic needs and mental health support.
Culture of Belonging, Safety, and Care 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cultivate a schoolwide climate where students feel emotionally and physically safe and cared for, particularly those who express feelings of sadness, worry, or isolation. <p><i>Action Steps:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Train staff in trauma-informed practices and build a peer mentoring program that fosters belonging. • Celebrate student success beyond academics—recognizing kindness, attendance, and growth—to promote a strengths-based school culture.
Powerful Student and Family Engagement 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Families are interested in English classes, access to basic resources, and consistent communication about how to support their children’s success. • Students and families are more likely to engage when they feel their needs are heard and addressed.
