# Quick Overview

## SB 328 In Effect 2022-2023

A new law that requires California's middle and high schools to revise start times by the start of the 2022-23 school year.



The new law does not apply to rural school districts; however, Central Unified does not match eligibility criteria to be considered a rural school district.



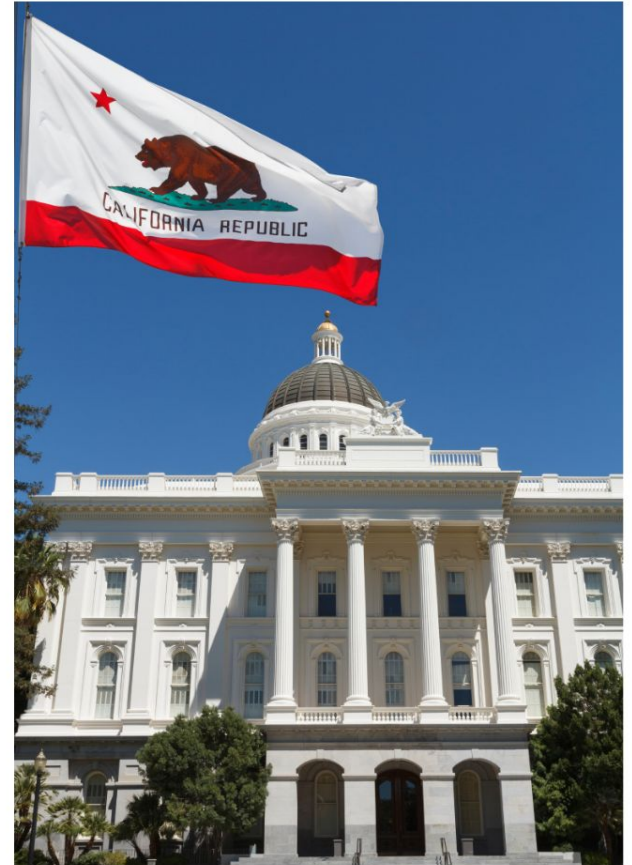
Middle schools to begin no earlier than 8:00 AM daily



High schools to begin no earlier than 8:30 AM daily



Shared Operations (transportation, food service, etc.) require changes at most, if not all, school sites.
