

Emergency Medical Technician - Basic 2025-2026

Short Course Description:	This course is designed to instruct a student to the level of Emergency Medical Technician-Basic, who serves as a vital link in the chain of the health care team. It is recognized that the majority of prehospital emergency medical care will be provided by the EMT-Basic. This includes all skills necessary for the individual to provide emergency medical care at a basic life support level with an ambulance service or other specialized service.

Airway	Airway, Practical Skills Lab: Airway, Evaluation
Patient Assessment	Scene Set-up, Initial Assessment, Focused History & physical Exam – Trauma Patients and Medical Patients, Detailed Physical Exam, On-Going Assessment, Communications, Documentation, Practical Skills Lab Patient Assessment, Evaluation
