Even if you have

Uncertain housing

A temporary address

No permanent physical address

you can enroll your child in school.

What Families Need to Know



Educational Rights For Children and Youth Lacking Fixed, Regular, and Adequate Housing

- You do not need a permanent address to enroll your child in school.
- 🏺 Your child cannot be denied school enrollment when school records or other enrollment documentation are not immediately available.
- $lap{\circ}$ Your child may be able to remain in the same school (school of origin) even if you move.
- You have the right to request transportation to the school of origin.
- $lap{ec{ullet}}$ If you and the school disagree about school enrollment, you may have the right to appeal.
- Your child automatically qualifies to participate in free school meals.
- Your child has the right to participate in federal, state, or local programs for which they are eligible.

Youth not accompanied by a parent or guardian and lacking fixed, regular, and adequate housing have these same rights.

At School, Ask About:

- School supplies
- Before and after school programs
- Tutoring and enrichment programs
- Summer school programs
- Preschool programs
- Contact information for community resources

Also, let the school know if your child needs special education, English language, or gifted programs.

Schools give children and youth experiencing homelessness hope and a chance for a better future.

Tips For Families Who Move Often -

- 🍎 Keep a copy of birth certificates and school records accessible.
- Safeguard all health and immunization records.
- Have a reliable person keep a second copy of the child's birth certificate, school records, and health information.
- Enroll children in school as soon as possible.

What You Can Do Before Moving

- Tell your child's teacher and principal that your child is moving and give them the new address.
- Let your McKinney-Vento liaison know if you want your child to stay in the school of origin.
- Ask for a copy of your child's school records, including immunizations.

The federal McKinney-Vento Act guarantees school enrollment for anyone who, due to a lack of permanent housing, lives in inadequate or temporary settings, such as:

- Emergency shelters or transitional housing
- Motels, hotels, or campgrounds due to lack of an adequate alternative
- Cars, parks, public places, bus or train stations, or abandoned buildings
- Doubled-up with relatives or friends due to loss of housing or economic hardship
