Burleson ISD offers a campus based Athletic Training and Sports Medicine Program at BHS and CHS. Students accepted into these programs would be placed on a CTE Health Science track AND participate in the campus after school Sports Medicine program. This track is designed for students interested in a future within an Allied Health Profession (i.e. Orthopedics, Nursing, Physical Therapy, Athletic Training, General Medicine). **Prior to graduation, students will receive a Public Service Endorsement or be eligible to sit for the Certified Patient Care Technician Exam.** Students would assist with the medical care of our UIL Athletics teams (Football, Volleyball, Basketball and more...). Students would have supervised learning under the guidance of Licensed/Certified Athletic Trainers. What is an Athletic Trainer? Recognized by the American Medical Association as an Allied Health Profession, the Licensed and/or Certified Athletic Trainer is a well trained professional and an integral part of a complete athletic program. The role of the Athletic Trainer includes prevention, treatment and rehabilitation of athletic injuries as well as education and counseling of athletes. An Athletic Trainer has a thorough knowledge of anatomy, physiology, psychology, nutrition, conditioning and other related areas.
