Valencia Park students are engaged learners who navigate their 1:1 iPad devices while app smashing. For example, students learn about the water system and create an animated short film using Notability to illustrate, iMotion to animate, iMovie to edit with audio, and post on Seesaw to explain how a system works using academic vocabulary. Our teachers use their iPad devices, MacBooks, and Apple TV devices to deliver lessons, model for students, and for gathering instructional resources. By integrating computer science with a literacy rich curriculum, students are able to deepen their understanding of Common Core standards. Through this practice, students become adept in intermixing apps and websites to showcase their thinking.

Robert C. Fisler School offers a wide range of unique educational opportunities, including a Computer Science Pathways program. Over the course of 15 years, cumulative practices helped build upon a vision that continues to thrive through the school's Computer Science Pathways program, with purposeful and personalized learning in each and every classroom. First and second grade students use 1:1 iPads, and third through eighth grades students have 1:1 laptops that serve as vehicles for optimizing powerful learning. The program offers progressive coding instruction and application of coding skills, with a focus on relevant career pathways such as robotics, web development, and app development. Coding skills are taught during the school day to all students, addressing coding concepts from block coding to language-based coding. The program highlights the greater purpose in utilizing tools and technology skills to discover pathways towards passion, accelerated academics, and/or future careers. Fisler School has received the Apple Distinguished School recognition for thirteen consecutive years for their innovative use of technology in the classroom.

Apple Distinguished Schools are centers of innovation, leadership, and educational excellence that use Apple technology to inspire creativity, collaboration, and critical thinking.
