JOB DESCRIPTION:

The Academically and Intellectually Gifted Teacher provides direct and indirect instruction to students, promotes advanced learning opportunities for all students, and collaborates with school personnel to ensure differentiation for all AIG learners.

QUALIFICATIONS:

ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS:

- Provide direct and indirect instructional support to AIG students needing differentiation in core subjects
- Plan and deliver engaging lessons using varied instructional methods and media tailored to gifted learners
- Organize enrichment activities that develop student potential and extend learning opportunities
- ➤ Model effective differentiation strategies for classroom teachers
- Collaborate with teachers to integrate AIG services into general education classrooms
- ➤ Coordinate and administer assessments for AIG identification and interpret results
- Lead professional development on best practices for teaching AIG students

- Maintain accurate records or student performance, identification, and services per state and district guidelines
- Create and maintain a positive, inclusive, and developmentally appropriate learning environment
- Support student behavior and learning through clear expectations and classroom management
- > Set and monitor instructional goals aligned with curriculum standards and student needs
- Evaluate and report on student academic and social growth regularly
- Participate in school-based initiatives such as School Improvement Teams and coteaching efforts

WORKING ENVIRONMENT:
