POSITION: PRE-K TEACHER

JOB DESCRIPTION:

The Pre-K Teacher is responsible for creating a nurturing, developmentally appropriate, and engaging learning environment for four-and five-year-old children. The teacher will implement the Opening the World of Learning (OWL) curriculum and align instruction with the North Carolina Foundations for Early Learning and Development.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- ➤ High School Diploma or Equivalent
- ➤ Must hold or be actively working toward a North Carolina Birth through Kindergarten (B-K) Continuing License or a Pre-K/K Add-on License issues by the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction (NCDPI)
- Must maintain active licensure and complete required Continuing Education Unites (CEUs)
- > Strong understanding of early childhood development and instructional strategies
- Experience with the Work Sampling System and the ECERS preferred
- Excellent communication, organization, and classroom management skills

ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS:

Develop and implement daily lesson plans using the OWL curriculum aligned with NC Foundations for Early Learning and Development

- Create and manage engaging learning centers (e.g. Blocks, Dramatic Play, Art, Science, Writing)
- > Foster language development through conversations, storytelling, and group reading
- ➤ Introduce foundational academic concepts such as colors, shapes, numbers, letters, and early literacy
- Conduct ongoing student assessments using the Work Sampling System and maintain individual portfolios
- Maintain accurate records including developmental screenings, health assessments, and attendance
- ➤ Conduct at least two parent-teacher conferences and one home visit annually
- > Support students' social-emotional growth and teach personal hygiene and self-care routines
- ➤ Ensure a safe, clean, and developmentally appropriate classroom environment in compliance with NC childcare licensure rules
- ➤ Always maintain required staff-child ratios
- Communicate regularly with families through newsletters reading logs, folders, and phone calls
- Attend all required professional development and maintain a minimum ECERS score of 5.0
- Collaborate with colleagues and administrators to support student success and program quality

WORKING ENVIRONMENT:

The usual and customary methods of performing the job's functions require the following physical demands: some lifting, carrying, pushing, and/or pulling; and significant fine finger dexterity. Work in this classification is considered light physical work requiring the exertion of up to 20 pounds of force occasionally and a negligible amount of force frequently or constantly to move objects. Generally, the job requires sitting, walking, and standing. This job is performed in a generally clean and healthy environment.
