CLARIFICATIONS / RESPONSES TO BIDDER QUESTIONS:

QUESTION 1: I have already sent in bid / estimate for project. Do I need to send in a new one, or is the one I already submitted still good?

District's Response 1: Please send in a new bid for this solicitation as the previous solicitation was cancelled.

QUESTION 2: We had a question about the checklist provided that includes items that need to be submitted with the offer. Number seven on the list states that a General Contractor's License with Highway Incidental Classification needs to be included with the offer. This isn't something that is usually required for striping parking lots. Is this license something that is required to perform these jobs?

District's Response 2: Please see the following information received by the S.C. Contractor's Licensing Board as it relates to the scope of work for this solicitation:

Any type of pavement marking over \$10,000 would only require the **Highway Incidental** classification:

"**Highway Incidental**" which includes highway work for grooving, milling, rehabilitating, and installing guardrails, gutters, highway signs, **pavement marking**, and painting.

If a contractor has the **Highway** classification, that includes the Highway Incidental classification. So, they could have either classification for that scope of work.

QUESTION 3: Can you please clarify the following:

On Page 33 there are 8 notes. Note 7 states to provide "Copy of General Contractors License with Highway Incidental Classification (or Highway Classification). Can you confirm 1) that this is indeed required and 2) if so, can you confirm why given SCLLR doesn't require either of those license classifications for these scopes of work.
